CYCLE FOR RECYCLING

Rotary Club member embarks on a 3,016km cycle through the heart of Australia to raise funds for impoverished communities in the Philippines.

Duncan Power is a member of the **Rotary Club of Gawler Light** and has been a dedicated Rotarian for three years. He is also the CEO of Dana Asia, a not-for-profit organisation registered in Australia that works to source funds for the development of projects and activities in Southeast Asia, working with local partners to create viable, scalable social businesses and educational opportunities aimed at breaking the cycle of poverty.

Close to Duncan's heart in life and work is achieving sustainable development in marginalised communities by addressing social and economic inequalities to give the world's poorest an equal opportunity to thrive.

An exciting new project has been designed to alleviate poverty in some of Metro Manila's poorest communities, whilst also restoring the environment. The **Rotary Club of Gawler Light** will work with charitable partner Dana Asia and the **Rotary Club of Manila** to achieve sustainable economic and environmental development. The new project has two core objectives:

- **1. Grow the local economy:** Through micro-economic and community development to create new opportunities for decent and productive work for women in impoverished communities.
- **2. Protect the environment:** Through the recycling of single-use plastics into eco-bricks and creating more sustainable alternatives to the continued usage of plastics which clog up natural waterways around the Philippines.

To raise awareness and funds for this new social business venture, Duncan has taken to his bicycle to cycle 3,016km along the Stuart Highway from Adelaide to Darwin. Dubbed "Cycle for Recycling", Duncan began the journey in April but was forced to postpone due to the lingering effects of Covid. Now back to full health, Duncan restarted his journey on 9th August and is making great progress – you can track his live whereabouts at www.danaasia.org/cycleforrecycling/#where.





The week will focus on completing the second of the ex-Leigh Creek houses with painting, the hanging of curtains and some general maintenance. It is also hoped that the Shearer's Cook's quarters will be painted and that renovations will commence on the main homestead. There will also be the opportunity for an 'environmental clean up' to ensure that items do not end up in the Frome. Of course it is also envisaged that there will be adequate time for Rotary fellowship, to discover more about the Mount Serle property and to visit the Iga Warta Community.

For anyone with a van you can hook up to either of the ex- Leigh Creek houses with 240 volt being provided by direct line. For those with campervans there are spaces within the Homestead block with access to toilet and shower facilities. There are also four beds (two singles in each of two rooms) available in the completed ex-Leigh Creek house. For those who wish to comp independently, there are some excellent positions within a few kms of the Homestead block.

Two special Interstate Youth Challenge Sails

The One & All tall ship will be in Melbourne in May/June 2023 officially as part of the Rotary International World Convention. She will be taking Conference delegates on short cruises on the Yarra from Docklands.

She is also offering the opportunity to young people to set sail for one of two seven day voyages.

The <u>first</u> 7-day Sailing Challenge will be voyaging around the rugged SA/Vic coastline when the One & All departs **Adelaide** on **Friday 26th May 2023** bound for Melbourne .The <u>second 7-day Sailing Challenge</u> will be returning to Adelaide, departing **Melbourne** on **Sunday 4th June 2023**.

South Australian and Victorian young people will be involved in both of these voyages.

These special voyages have already created a lot of interest so we would urge clubs to inform us if they feel they may want to participate. The total cost of these Special Voyages is \$1,900pp. It comprises:

- the shipboard cost of the young people for seven days
- additional insurance and Melbourne Harbour costs for the One & All
- interstate air fares and sundry accommodation and transport costs for interstate young people joining or returning from a Challenge Sail.

We are expecting commercial sponsorship will cover some of these costs particularly for disadvantaged students but would ask clubs to select (where possible, otherwise we can help) suitable students remembering we wish to have a wide variety of young people including young people who are considered disadvantaged.

We hope that clubs will raise as much of the \$1,900 as possible with a minimum of \$1,100. There is an opportunity for clubs to share the cost. (We would hate to see a disadvantaged young person miss out, so if your club falls short of the total, contact us and we will see if commercial sponsorship may be able to assist in getting them aboard.)
