

Why are we changing?




Why did we change to Rotary Community Groups?



Works directly with clubs across the Zone to provide guidance in their specific area of expertise.


Portfolio Committees

In your Rotary Community Groups!



STEP ONE: SET THE SCENE AND PREPARE TO ELECT YOUR ROTARY COMMUNITY LEADER

- What do you want to work on together?
- What sort of leadership and support would help you succeed?
- What arrangements will work for you?

In your Rotary Community Groups!



STEP TWO: ELECT YOUR ROTARY COMMUNITY LEADER

- Your facilitator and partner in growth!
- Must be a member of a club in your RCG
- One vote per club, preferential

In your Rotary Community Groups!



STEP THREE: FIRST MEETING WITH YOUR ROTARY COMMUNITY LEADER

- Get to know each other
- Create/start to create your growth plan
- Include: community impact, Rotary profile, membership growth and experience

In your Clubs!



- Where do you get support from?
 - Peer support from your Rotary Community Group
 - Support from your Rotary Community Leader
 - Expertise from a Rotary Specialist
 - Initiatives, resources and programs from Portfolio Committees

Three step process to create the RCG growth plan

Step One

Set the scene and prepare to elect your RCL

Step Two

Elect your RCL – facilitator and partner in growth

Must be a club member in the RCG

One vote per club, preferential

Step Three

First meeting with the RCL

Create/begin the growth plan

Include: community impact, Rotary profile, membership growth and experience

At every step

Bring your clubs with you!

Ask - how will you and they make the most of the RCG for your club?

What development does your club need?

Mid Feb – mid March Establishment Meetings held to prepare for RCL elections (1-2 leaders from each club)

March – April
Nominations and
elections – 1 RCL for
each RCG, one vote
per club, preferential

May – June RCLs confirmed, first meeting of RCGs set up!

Rotary Specialists





What is a Rotary Specialist?

Individuals or teams of people who are experts in a particular field and will:

- Give advice and/or support to clubs
- Know who other experts are
- Liaise with clubs remotely or in person

Applications open: February 2024

They can be:

- People who have been in Rotary for a few months or a few decades
- People who have never held a position outside of their club before
- Rotaractors
- Current or former Assistant/Area
 Governors
- Current or previous District leaders
