



DISTRICT AND GLOBAL GRANT REQUIREMENTS 2024 – 2025 ROTARY YEAR

- Must be in good standing; having paid Rotary International and Area 60/District 7475 dues.
- Must have set Rotary Club Foundation Giving Goals, including goals for Annual Giving and Polio Plus, by July 15, 2024.
- President-elect must have attended PETS or meet district PETS makeup requirements.
- Two members (Club Foundation Chair-Elect, Club President-Elect, a Club Officer, or a club member designated by the President-Elect) must have attended Qualification Seminar in 2024 to be eligible for a District Grant.
- District Grant requires a club one-to-one match.
- District Grants are available at the following levels and anything in between:
 - Minimum District Grant (\$500 club contribution + \$500 Foundation match = \$1,000 grant)
 - Maximum District Grant (\$3,500 club contribution + \$3,500 Foundation match = \$7,000 grant)
- A District Grant with a collaborating district partner, other Rotary or Rotaract club(s), is allowed.
- A club may participate in up to two District Grants, one of which must be with a collaborating partner(s).
- For District Grants over \$1,000, a Public Image plan for the project is required.
- Grant Projects can be repeated from previous years.
- If your club wants to apply for a Global Grant, members of the grant committee must complete the Grant Management Seminar (10 courses) in the RI Learning Center and provide the completion certificates to the Grants Committee Chair.
- Rotary Foundation Memorandum of Understanding must be signed by the Club President and the Club President-Elect by June 30, 2024.
