YOUR VOICE WAS HEARD

On October 16, the district presented a program concerned with a new fundraising tool called EVENTGROOVE. This initiative was suggested by Zone and a record number of Rotarians were in attendance. It was then suggested that clubs review the recording to grasp the concept of this new funding strategy. On October 27, the district called for a vote to determine the possible use and the result was a unanimous vote of approval.

Several leadership members met once again with Robert Friend who gave an update and the leadership is now going through the requirements for usage.

Within a few short weeks-clubs will be able to avail themselves of this new way of fundraising. DG Ann promised you a Voice in decision-making and she was pleased with the response from the membership.

WORLD POLIO DAY

World Polio Day raised \$900,000 through online giving at Rotary International with 2000 first time donors in the mix. Julie Ann Juliano is spearheading our Polio Plus initiative. Please continue to donate since we are so close to meeting our goal of eradicating Polio.

GRANT UPDATE FROM ZONE

The Foundation Trustees have made a change to the way global grants will be funded. They will stop matching cash contributions to grants because of the high demand for global grants giving clubs and districts more flexibility in financing grant activity.

Direct from the Foundation-there is no longer a minimum World Fund match for global grants. This means that grant sponsors can use any combination of DDF, cash, or directed gifts and endowment earnings to fund a global grant, as long as the minimum project budget is \$30,000. The Maximum World Fund award remains \$40,000. The Foundation will provide a 100 percent World Fund match for all DDF contributions, but not match cash contributions. The best way to ensure sufficient World Fund Resources for grant activity in the future is to give as generously as possible to the Annual Fund Share.

PDG Andy Calamaras is our Grant Committee Chair. His team is well-versed on Foundation matters.

At RI, the How to Use the Grant Center guide has been updated to reflect these changes.

IMPORTANT-THIS CLARIFICATION ABOUT INTERNATIONAL CONTRIBUTIONS TO GLOBAL

GRANTS-For Global Grants, 15 percent of all contributions, not of the project budget, need to come from outside the country. This corrects a previous communication from Zone.
