

Grant Funding







To apply for a district grant – clubs must meet ALL the qualification requirements

- 1. <u>2025-2026 Member Dues Invoice</u> (for first half of the year) must be paid in full 30 days after receipt of invoice or July 30, 2025 (whichever comes later)
- 2. <u>Member Dues</u> and <u>PELS dues</u> must be paid in full 30 days after receipt of invoice or July 30 2025, whichever comes later.
- 3. Clubs may have No outstanding dues to District or RI from previous years.
- 4. All 2025-2026 Club Officers must be entered in ClubRunner by July 1, 2025.
- 5. Club must have established <u>Foundation giving goals</u> on Rotary Club Central by July 15, 2025, per district guidelines.
- 6. Club President Elect (or approved designee) must have attended MNE PELS 2025 (or completed alternate training as approved by DGE)
- 7. Two club officers must attend district offered Grant Qualification Seminars (May 8 or 13)



D7475 District Grant Guidelines FY 2025-2026

- District Grant requires a club one-to-one matching of funds
- For FY 2025-26, District Grants are available at the following levels and anything in between:
 - a. Minimum District Grant \$1,000: includes a \$500 club contribution and \$500 Foundation match
 - b. Maximum District Grant \$5,000: includes \$2,500 club contribution and \$2,500 Foundation match



D7475 District Grant Guidelines - FY 2025-2026

A Second District Grant For Clubs

- Clubs may participate in up to two District Grants, one of which must be with a collaborating partner(s) providing <u>significant community impact</u>:
 - Partners could be other Rotary or Rotaract Club/s from D7475
- For FY 2025-26, Collaborated Grants District Grants are available at the following levels and anything in between:
 - a. Minimum District Grant \$2,000: includes a \$1000 club contribution and \$1000 Foundation match
 - b. Maximum District Grant \$10,000: includes \$5000 club contribution and \$5000 Foundation match

EXCEPTION CRITERIA- The maximum Grant for a club who contributed less than \$1,000 to the Rotary Foundation in FY2024-25 is \$1,000. This limit includes collaboration grants.



D7475 Applying For District GrantsBest Practices and Approval Criteria

- Grants may not be approved for the full amount requested depending on availability of funds to cover all grant requests received.
- Grant must demonstrate significant community impact, meeting a need in the community. Applicants must provide details on the application.
- For District Grants over \$1,000, a Public Image plan for the project is required to be submitted with the Grant Application.
- Grant Projects can be repeated from previous years, but prior approval does not mean a Grant is automatically approved for the FY2025-26 year.
- To receive Grant funds for an approved grant, at the time of receiving the funds, the club is clear of all RI and District 7475 dues and assessments.

Grant payment will not be made until all dues and assessments are paid in full.

D7475 Global Grant Qualification Requirements

To apply for a global grant – clubs must meet <u>all</u> the District Grant qualification requirements

Additionally, <u>Before</u> submitting an application for a Rotary Global Grant:

- Club Members responsible for the Global Grant must complete:
 - Grant Management Seminar in the RI Learning Center
 - Provide the completion certificates to the District Grants Committee Chair.

• The Rotary Foundation MOU document must be signed by the Club President and the Club President-Elect and submitted to the District 7475 Grants Committee Chair.

Grants must be impactful and fall within Rotary's Seven Areas of Focus

District 7475 District Grant Funds are available to eligible clubs for projects that will be conducted during the Rotary Year 2025-2026. District Grants are intended to support impactful projects that meet an identified need in a community or local area. The need must fall within Rotary's Seven Areas of focus, and the project must involve the active participation of Rotarians.

District Grants can be applied for and conducted in collaboration with other Rotary Clubs. The approach is encouraged for greater community impact.

The District Grant program is part of The Rotary Foundation (TRF). Funds for Districts Grants are provided by TRF and managed and distributed to our clubs by the District. The specific amount available each year is based on how much








