RECORDER'S RAMBLINGS

Nobles:

In 2013, the Divan approved several Al Azhar Policies and Procedures and these were distributed to Club/Unit Leaders and Secretaries in 2014. Since there have been several personnel changes over the past 2 years, I will use this forum to continue to remind Clubs/Units of some of them.

- 1. For expenditures of "unrestricted funds" by clubs/units
 - A "sole source" purchase or contract award for an approved expenditure may be given for expenditures LESS THAN \$5,000 providing past purchase or contract performance has been acceptable.
 - For purchases and contracts EXCEEDING \$5,000, at least two quotes MUST be solicited.
 - Purchase and contract award should be done on the basis of price and technical specifications. Preferential purchase and contract award to a Fraternal Member may be given IF it is within 10% of the lowest bid.

Copies of the above policy are available from the Recorder. More to come next issue.

"Over the past little while, people have been thanking us for volunteering to chair the *Exceptional Care for Exceptional Kids* Campaign. While it has been an honour to lead this historic five-year initiative, our time as Co-Chairs has shown us that the success of the campaign has been a true collective effort," says Richard Renaud. "Thanks to every single donor, we were able to construct this beautifully designed and spacious hospital and acquire top-notch medical equipment. Our donors enabled us to open a state-of-the-art research centre which will accelerate discoveries in musculoskeletal disorders. Thanks to all of them, children and families from across Canada, parts of the United States and around the world have access to cutting-edge paediatric orthopedic care."

"Our new hospital is a beautiful and functional building, one that we can be so proud of within our network of hospitals," says Dale W. Stauss, Chairman of the Board of Trustees for Shriners Hospitals for Children. "I wish to congratulate our volunteer corporate leaders and staff members who have led the *Exceptional Care for Exceptional Kids* Campaign to successful fruition.

History of the Exceptional Care for Exceptional Kids Campaign

The five-year *Exceptional Care for Exceptional Kids* Campaign began in 2011 and launched publically on May 13, 2014. It was the first-ever capital campaign undertaken by the Canada

Shriners Hospital and the most successful campaign every undertaken by the network of 22 Shriners Hospitals for Children, which are located in Canada, United States and Mexico.

"With our children and their families in mind, we created a warm and welcoming hospital," says Imperial Potentate Jerry G. Gantt. "The building itself is beautiful, each floor designed to reflect a different region of Canada from the Atlantic to the Pacific and the Great North; each floor is designed to be a place of healing, a haven for the children and families who turn to us for care. But it is much more than a building. It is a place where researchers work side by side with clinicians to find the cause of bone disorders and endeavor to find better treatments and new cures. It is a place where we will offer new state-of-the-art services such as movement analysis and pediatric simulation training. A place where we will focus on improving the lives of the children we treat, the care they receive and the training we provide to up-and-coming healthcare professionals."

The construction of the new hospital began in April 2013. The new building is almost three times larger than the former hospital, which was located on Cedar Avenue in Montreal.

The new Shriners Hospital for Children – Canada features a range of new services and technologies including 22 single-patient rooms, four surgical suites including one designed specifically for back surgery and a 200-seat education centre to enhance the hospital's teaching mission.

AI Azhar pledged \$300,000 to the campaign and contributed \$630,000

Aurélie

Aurélie just turned 14, is in secondary 2, and was born with a leg length discrepancy. By the age of 12, her left leg was 50 millimeters shorter than her right. She underwent major surgery and eight months of painful leg lengthening. The result? She's back to all her favourite sports and despite her young age, is challenging herself to an adult Spartan Race this July.

Philippe

Philippe, 18, was born with cerebral palsy. He's been a patient at Canada Shriners Hospital since he was a baby and has undergone four surgeries and hours of physiotherapy. When 5 years old, Philippe had a selective dorsal rhizotomy and spent two months at the hospital recovering and learning how to walk again. He later had a heal chord extension, a hamstring release and Botox in both legs. The cerebral palsy has also meant an intellectual disability and ADHD, but Philippe has learned to manage it and is challenging himself to a Spartan Race this year.
