Council of Legislation 2016

I would like to inform you on how to propose resolution or amendment for Council of Legislation 2016. All clubs and districts are authorized to submit projects which must be received at Rotary International Headquarters no later than December 31, **2014**. No project will be accepted beyond that date and no derogation to this rule will be granted. Beginning this year, the projects must be submitted via the online form. A printed form is also available on request for those with no Internet access. Clubs and districts must submit a separate form for each project. The draft amendments, a Word document showing the changes to be downloaded with the form. These documents are available on

A draft resolution, for the clubs and districts must use the <u>resolution</u> <u>model</u> and download it with the form.

To be considered as being in good form, any project submitted to the Rotary must include a statement of the reasons not to exceed 300 words and identifying the problem or the situation that the project aims to correct and the solution provided by the project. Any project submitted without statement of reasons shall be considered noncompliant and will not be sent to the Council of legislation..

Finally, please note that the projects must be approved by resolutions during the district conference or a district meeting, or by a vote by mail before being submitted to the Council. The Governor may submit the project itself and confirm that the project was approved by the district or, if the project is not submitted by the Governor, confirm that the information provided are correct by e-mail to council services@rotar y.org.
