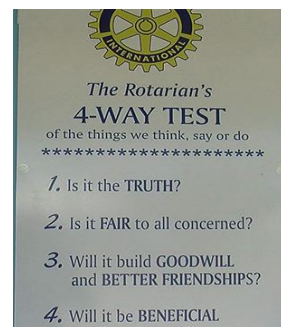


Caribbean Partnership Conference 2014

After a joint evening of high quality, I could visit the clubs and enjoy the launch of the sickle cell disease awareness project conducted by the Rotary Club of

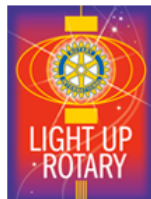
Paramaribo Central.

Rotary has heart is one way to do good in the world

Each of us as Rotarians has received a gift – a gift of membership in Rotary made possible by a caring person who proposed our membership. We have and continue to enjoy the friendship, fellowship, and networking in our club and throughout the Rotary world. As a part of this gift, we have also been given an opportunity – an opportunity to leverage our ability to make a difference in the world as we reach out to help others. We leverage by pooling resources with our club, district, and The Rotary Foundation. As we look around for the most pressing need, in addition to eradicating polio, alleviation of hunger stands tall. The presence of hunger, both locally and globally, is a tragedy.

In the USA, 1 in 6 has to deal with food insecure situations. Included in this, 16 million children (20% of all children) are in this precarious state. Globally, five million children die each year from malnutrition related causes.

Throughout Zones 33 and 34, under the "Rotary Has Heart" initiative, Rotarians, clubs, and districts are encouraged to focus on alleviation of hunger, particularly with children. Valentine's Day 2014 will be a special time for clubs and districts to feed hungry children. Each club decides how it wants to participate. This is one way we demonstrate that **Rotary Has Heart** – that we believe in **Doing Good in the World**.

This is to report the very sad news that Rotarian Glenda Joyette, Treasurer of the Rotary Club of St Vincent South, passed away on Sunday January 19th, evening. I have met Glenda on more than one occasion, most recently during my visit to St Vincent three weeks ago at her Club's meeting.

A situation of crisis followed causing enormous damage in the three abovementioned Islands: lives marked, houses swept away, damaged infrastructure, etc.: a disaster!

Very quickly, a mobilization is set up in our district 7030.

On behalf of all Rotarians, I thank

PDG Stephen RAMROOP, PDG Tony WATKINS, AG Roger BOSE, AG Marvlyn BIRMINGHAM, AG Brian GLASGOW and AG Tim MOFFAT.

They strongly mobilized and other Rotarians came to reinforce their initiative and allowed the establishment of a real solidarity.

The Districts 7000 (Puerto Rico) and 7020 (Northern Caribbean), all as friends of Barbados, Grenada and Martinique, have made a direct contribution (in-kind and cash) to the concerned territories.

Many thanks to Trinidad clubs which brought more than 300 mattresses to ODPM for the claims.

A point will be made at the next District Conference in Martinique.

The reconstruction began, and with PDG Steve SCHULTER, District 6910, a device based on a global grant is being prepared. The Rotary Clubs of Saint - Vincent have decided to adopt a woman who lost her father, her mother, her brother, her sister and her son. It is without saying that they will receive the support of our district in their approach.
