1. ROTARY DAY OF SERVICE – 21ST SEPTEMBER 2021 – UNITED NATIONS INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PEACE.

As Rotarians, one of our focus areas is peace and conflict prevention/resolution.

Our first **Rotary District 7030 Service Day** is **21 September 2021**, the **International Day of Peace**.

On this day, **our District's Call to Action and Service Day** is for all Rotarians, Rotaractors and Interactors to be encouraged to share messages that prevent conflict and promote peaceful interaction online **to end cyberbullying and online abuse within our communities**.

Our goal is to reach at least 25% of non-Rotary members.

In partnership with the UN agency for children, UNICEF, specific online safety messages have been developed to keep our children and young people safe (see attachments).

EVERY CLUB is encouraged to share these messages and guidelines with children, young people, teachers, parents and the business community.

Document your Club's activities and you will be eligible to enter the District 7030 'Give Peace a Chance' Initiative Competition!

Service above self - **Everyone** can share and discuss these messages **with at least one other person** whether in your family, at work, within your social networks or in your community! **On 21 September, how else can you serve to spread these safety guidelines and peace messages?**

Some suggestions:

- Social media – Upload and/or 'Like' and 'Share' the social media posts (graphics and videos) which will be provided to all clubs for use on 21 September. Translate or adapt them as appropriate. Share widely among your friends and networks!
- TV & Radio – Schedule radio and TV interviews on this issue using the messages and safety tips as a guide.
- Print media – Sponsor or arrange for messages to be published in local newspapers.
- Interpersonal communication – Arrange to make presentations in schools (e.g., through Ministries of Education or Parent-Teacher Associations) or liaise with youth groups or religious leaders to make presentations to young people and their parents.
- Signage – Create posters or billboards using the messages. Consider working with children and young people to create them.
- Business community partnerships – Liaise with Chambers of Commerce and business associates to disseminate the messages.
- SMS – Liaise with telemarketers to send SMS texts with online safety messages.

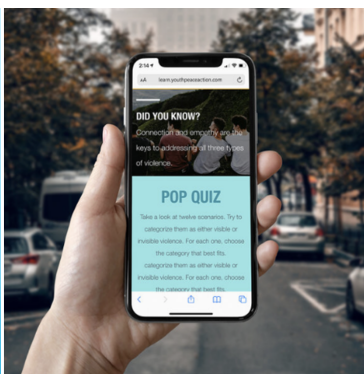

4. GIVE PEACE A CHANCE PROJECT CHALLENGE IN DISTRICT 7030

OBJECTIVE:

The objective is to encourage and support today's motivated youth to create and try out their own ideas for facilitating, encouraging and promoting peace in their community.

We will encourage Rotarians, Rotaractors and Interactors in the District to use their creativity to design projects and employ innovative techniques for engaging project participants in ways that focus on conflict resolution, reconciliation, building understanding and breaking down barriers which cause conflict, and finding solutions for resolving conflict and maintaining peace.

ELIGIBILITY:

To be eligible for consideration each participating Club MUST partner with a:

- Rotary club
- Rotaract Club
- Interact Club

BUT

- Partnership with one Rotaract Club will attract 5 judging points.
- Partnership with One Rotaract Club AND One Interact Club will attract 7 judging points.

HOW TO APPLY:

Submit a 4 minute "video application" by October 21st, 2021, to the Peace Committee from your team describing:

- the project, what root cause of conflict do you hope to address, for example:
 - bullying, including cyber bullying,
 - conflict resolution or reconciliation,
 - developing leadership and mediation skills for those in conflict or post conflict societies,
 - restorative practices to resolve conflict.
- Describe your specific activity:
 - Project partners (list at least one),
 - Expected outcome.
- Timeline for completion - Project cycle will be within July 01st 2021 to March 01st 2022.

PROJECT SUBMISSIONS:

Completed projects are to be submitted to the District Peace Committee via a 7-minute video presentation by March 01st 2022.

JUDGING: A 3-PART PROCESS:

Part 1 of 3: A panel of five judges from the District peace Committee will assess the presentations on the following criteria:

- Creativity (maximum 20 points)
- Teamwork (maximum 20 points)
- Collaboration (maximum 20 points)

- Sustainability (maximum 20 points)

Part 2 of 3: The short list of presentations will be uploaded to the District Website with an invitation to vote for the “People’s Choice” to earn 20 points leading into final judging.

Part 3 of 3: Committee to meet to adjudicate on final winner, with People Choice securing an automatic 20 points.

PRIZES:

Cash prize to help promote the winning project as follows:

- 1st Prize – USD \$1,000 to the winning project.
- 2nd Prize – USD \$500 for second place.

Prizes are to be used to add value to the project for sustainability.
