






Foundation Mission



District Grants

Rotary Foundation Global Grants





District Grants

- Single "block" grant awarded annually
- Local or international activities
- Activities align with TRF mission
- Local decision making with broader guidelines
- Smaller activities and projects
- Up to 50% of District Designated Funds





Global Grants

- Long-term projects
- Sustainable outcomes
- Larger grant awards aligned with areas of focus
- World Fund match
- Two options:
 - club- and district-developed
 - packaged





Qualification

- Qualification provides clubs with financial and stewardship controls to meet Foundation requirements and successfully manage grant-funded activities.
- Clubs will need to qualify before applying for global grants.


