

Rotary District 5690 Global Grant Scholarship Guidelines and Rules – effective 15 Oct 2013

This scholarship is for graduate study for one (1) to four (4) years.

- Annual awards must be of \$30,000.00 or more
- Applications will be accepted from candidates who have completed a minimum of 60 hours of undergraduate study
- Studies must be in one of the 6 Areas of Focus identified by Rotary International:
 - Peace and conflict prevention/resolution
 - Disease prevention and treatment
 - Water and sanitation
 - Maternal and child health
 - Basic education and literacy
 - Economic and community development
- Studies must be at a fully accredited college/university located outside of the United States
- Applicants must have been accepted into this institution at the time of the application
- The applicant must be sponsored by a Club in the District
- The District must supply a sponsor for the student, preferably from the sponsoring Club
- The applicant must be proficient in the home language of the country in which the student will study
- The successful applicant must agree to attend an orientation session offered by Rotary International, either in person or online, and comply with all applicable RI requirements
- The successful applicant must agree to complete a minimum of 6 presentations to clubs in the District and complete a written report at the conclusion of each funded year(s) of study
- The District will attempt to obtain a “Host District or Club” in the area where the student will be studying. If this is not possible, it will not disqualify the student from receiving the scholarship
- The applicant must be sponsored by a Rotary Club in the District
- The applicant cannot have begun studies prior to the submission of the application
- The applicant must have a permanent address within the bounds of District 5690. Temporary addresses, such as college/university addresses, do not qualify
- The applicant cannot be a Rotarian or related to a Rotarian as per Rotary International guidelines

Application Deadline: February 1 annually.

Application must be submitted to sponsoring club.

Both financial need and academic accomplishment will be considered in evaluating applicants. As a representative of Rotary International, the District and our Clubs, applicants will be evaluated as to their abilities and interest in this role, and this evaluation will be a factor in selecting candidates.
