

#### Pancake Breakfast

To celebrate Pleasantville High School's Homecoming game and raise money for the Community Scholarship Fund of Pleasantville (www. pvillecsf.com), the Rotary Club of Pleasantville runs a Pancake Breakfast. At this event, which has taken place for over 35 years, Club members serve over 300 breakfasts of pancakes, scrambled eggs, and sausage. Last year, the Club donated \$1,500 to the Community Scholarship Fund, which awarded \$45,000+ in scholarships to graduating High School seniors.



#### Smoke Alarm Project

Since 1990, the Rotary Club of Pleasantville has given a smoke detector to every kindergartener in the Pleasantville Elementary School. This year event takes place on October 6, during Fire Safety Week, when the Pleasantville Volunteer Fire Department (www.pleasantvillefire.org) visits to the school. During the school assembly where the smoke detectors are distributed, Fire Department representatives explain to the children what they should do if a fire breaks out in their home. It is estimated that the Club has provided over 2,500 smoke detectors in the past 20 years.
