On the Polio Battlefront

Polio's return to Syria as we all read in the New York Times and all of the major media outlets reinforce the urgent need to interrupt transmission in the remaining endemic countries: Nigeria, Afghanistan and Pakistan. These countries serve as reservoirs where the poliomyelitis virus is transmitted from person to person in a continuous chain. Infected person then travel and infect susceptible persons in other countries, leading to outbreaks.

In the past year alone, the polio virus traced to these polio reservoir countries (Nigeria and Pakistan) has sparked outbreaks in the Horn of Africa, and north Syria. The Type 1 virus has turned up in both Egypt and Israel, where thankfully it has not caused cases due to the high immunization rates in the local population.


It is imperative we Rotarians continue the battle to END POLIO NOW and to interrupt the transmission in these three endemic countries. With no source for the new outbreaks, the end of polio will closely follow.

The good news is endemic countries have made remarkable progress this year. Collectively, they have reduced case counts by nearly 40%

compared to this time last year. Afghanistan's traditionally endemic Southern Region has not seen a single case since November 20012.

Going forward the Gates Foundation will match two-to-one, up to 35 million dollars per year, every dollar that Rotarians, Rotary Clubs and Districts make to Polio Eradication. If this is fully realized, the value of this new partnership with Rotary is more than \$500 million US. This way your contributions to Polio Plus will work twice as hard.


