A Rotarian Cheer for Jim Kushner & Friends Helping Those in the Philippines

The following letter was received from Ky Williams of the Inwood Rotary Club:

Dear R.I. President, Rotarians, and Friends,

This is a note to share that we just found out that our Rotarian Jim (James) Kushner and many friends have succeeded in not only getting 1.5 million servings of food to a port in the Philippines from Oklahoma, through Outreach, Inc., but is ... as you will read in a moment ... now in the process of getting that food from that port to devastated area's in the Philippines brought about by Typhoon Haiyan this past November. Some of these area's the food is going to, I understand, have yet to receive any aid.

So ... let's give a Rotarian Cheer for Jim and to all supporters, contributors, & helpers along the way reaching out to aid those people suffering, who have survived ... I know that Jim has worked - practically non-stop - to begin this particular work for relief and to see it through.

Jim's ongoing works, now in the Philippines, began with sending our able disaster-relief Rotarian, Todd Shea, there to help, including assisting our Philippine Rotarian Districts as one of the 1st Responders needed shortly after this disaster began. He will now continue to give his own hands-on support while he remains in the Philippines aiding those in ravaged areas for the next few weeks... If you can help Jim further, please let me know.

This is what I just cropped out from Jimmy Kushner's new Facebook site that was posted 2/13/14 by Consuelo Locop near Tabok, Philippines: "Finally, after 3long toxic days of processing unreasable docs, our 5 40-footer containers filled with nutritional rice packs have finally been released from Cebu International Seaport. Thanks to Somebody Cares America for these goods & to Just Projects International, Love Asia Missions Partner, Operation Airdrop, James Jimmy Kushner New York & Brian Lydon."











Fighting Polio in Syria

The United Nations said Wednesday a polio vaccination campaign has begun in Syria's encircled Yarmouk camp, UNRWA has secured the formal authorization for the transfer of 10,000 polio vaccines to Yarmouk. The process has been completed without incident and the vaccination of thousands of children in the camp is now under way.

Our Foundation (The Rotary Foundation) provided a \$500,000 emergency response grant to support efforts to stem the recent polio outbreak in Syria. The funds are the first to the World Health Organization in direct support of a Global Polio Eradication Initiative are conducting large-scale immunization campaigns in the Middle East.

Rotary Syrian Refugee Children Project

Syrian children are losing their lives, their homes, their parents and their schooling. Many refugees have little or no opportunity to take any belongings with them. They flee with just the clothes on their back and what they can carry.

Syrian refugees are in a desperate need of humanitarian assistance, especially thechildren. Many are wounded, exhausted, terrified and have health and nutrition problems. 75 percent of the Syrian refugees are women and children.

This project is an International Rotary humanitarian response to the Syrian Crisis in cooperation between Rotary District 7230 in New York and Bermuda and Rotary District 1130 in London. Friendship Exchange Committee Extends Deadline for Applications to Scotland Trip

The Friendship Exchange Committee has extended the deadline for applications to be submitted for the upcoming trip to Scotland to March 31, 2014. The team will visit Scotland as guests of the Scotlish Rotarians from May 30, 2014, to June 8, 2014.

The Program is a wonderful opportunity to travel, to cultivate new friends from another country, and understand another culture first hand. Instead of visiting a foreign country/city as typical tourists, we would stay with local Rotarians who would show us what's best in their area, while we also share their home and their family life. This is far more meaningful and fulfilling in terms of cultural understanding, and paves the way for long-term relationships on the individual, Club, and District levels - one of the



best ways to enhance international understanding while enjoying Scottish hospitality.

The District plans to send a team of five Rotarians and an adult companion each, i.e., a maximum of 10 adults. Participating Rotarians will bear their own airfare to Scotland, and take care of their own visa requirements. While ticket prices vary, they are expected to cost around \$1,500. Local lodging, boarding and transportation will be provided for by the local Rotarians. Team members may choose to spend more time in Scotland at their own expense.

The reciprocal exchange from Scotland is expected to occur next year. Team members would host the incoming team, and showcase the best of New York hospitality.

Full details, and the application form, are in the last issue of Engageletter (February 2014), available at the District's website. Please note that members will be selected on a first-come-first-served basis, and hence, those who are seriously interested should apply asap.

Last year's Exchange was with Bangalore, India, and was a thoroughly enjoyable experience for all concerned. The full report was published in the February 2013 issue of the District Newsletter, which is also available in the District website.

Also, he was awarded a Letter of Commendation for Services as a "Tiger Team" member from 22-28 August 2000. He assisted fellow sailors during readiness of all vital engineering spaces while at sea. He fulfilled his 4-year commitment with a "Good Conduct Medal and received a Honorable Discharge while on the Aegis Destroyer -USS McFaul DDG-74.
