### Why the focus on End Human Trafficking?

(NOT OFFICIAL) The next big thing for Rotary after ending Polio?

- Human Trafficking is on rise. "This is a growth industry"
  - Louise Shelly, professor of public policy and author of Human Trafficking: A Global Perspective
- In 2017, worldwide 24.9 Million victims trapped by modern day slavery
  - 19% were sexually exploited (other types are labor and forced labor in various occupations)
  - \$150 Billion industry worldwide
- In 2017, in the US 4.5 Million victims were trafficked (~20K are trafficking into US)
  - 80% is sex trafficking, nearly half are children
- Governor Noem declared August as Human Trafficking Awareness month

### Are you aware that Human Trafficking....

- Adverse Childhood Experiences have a tremendous impact on future:
  - Violence victimization and perpetration
  - Drug usage
  - Higher risk of injury
  - Mental health problems
  - Teen pregnancy
  - Involvement in human trafficking incidents
- Morale of the story: Get involved in anything that positively impacts/reduce the vulnerability of a child!

### Statistically in South Dakota...

- Approximately 15,000 Reports of child abuse and neglect per year
- Human Trafficking is not related to a specific population
- Familial Trafficking is prevalent (adult using child in exchange for food, housing, other resources)
  - The average age in the US is 12 -14 years old. Many victims are runaway girls who were sexually abused as children.
- 99% of traffickers were abused as children
- In 2014, through SD Codified Law 2-6-31, Jolene's Law Task Force was formed to study the prevalence and impact of child sexual abuse
  - Laws regarding child abuse/neglect and mandatory reporting of this crime are found in SD Codified Law Chapters 26-7A and -8A
- In 2016, the Task Force grew to a 10 year Strategic plan and outlined six major goals and 48 supporting objectives for a comprehensive approach towards ending child sexual abuse. Center for Prevention of Child Maltreatment (CPCM) partnered with agencies who focus specifically on sex trafficking.
- Data in South Dakota is lacking because of jurisdictional issues and inconsistent reporting requirements. The majority of information on sexual violence in South Dakota does NOT include data from tribal communities.








# District 5610 Global Grant History

  - Assist widespread SD Resilient Communities resources framework










