

Mentor Expectations

Meet at least once a month for the first 4-6 months. Be proactive in setting up meetings to make sure you meet.

Suggest you start each meeting seeing what questions they have.

Review the suggested outline with the new member. You can cover additional information. If they have a question you don't know, contact someone for the answer.

Review the Yellow Badge requirements and make sure they are progressing with them.

Cover the different committees to help them join at least one. If they indicate an interest in a committee consider contacting that chair to invite them to the next meeting.

Take them under your wing—sit with them at meetings, introduce them to others, be available to answer questions, make sure they are going to the socials and service projects.

We know that the more engaged a member is the more likely they will be active and stay a member. That is why you, the mentor, is so important!
