Whereas, In 1985, Rotary launched PolioPlus and spearheaded efforts with the World Health Organization, United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and UNICEF to immunize the children of the world against polio; and,

Whereas, Polio cases have dropped by 99.9 percent since 1988, and the world stands on the threshold of eradicating the disease; and,

Whereas, Rotary has contributed more than 1.7 billion dollars and countless volunteer hours to the protection of more than 2.5 billion children in 122 countries; and,

Whereas, These efforts are providing much needed operational support, medical personnel, laboratory equipment, and educational materials for health workers and parents; and,

Whereas, There are 28 Rotary clubs across South Dakota that actively sponsor service projects to address such critical issues as poverty, health, hunger, illiteracy, and the environment in their communities and abroad:
