DG Nancy's Message

Hello District 5610 Rotarians,

Over and over during our visits to clubs around the District I keep hearing about the good work of Rotary. Every time

I listen to a Board talk about what they do in the community and around the world, I feel blessed to be a Rotarian in District 5610. The interesting thing, however, is that nearly every group starts by saying that they don't do as much as they should be doing, but by the time I finish writing down what the club is accomplishing, I have a long list of achievements.

Clubs have Projects!

For example, our clubs do a great deal with the Back Pack programs. Some clubs primarily provide financial support while others physically pack food into the Back Packs every week during the school year. In addition to feeding children, Rotarians provide opportunities for children to enjoy themselves at Storybook Island and the Children's Museum. Most clubs provide scholarships so that students in their area have help with their

post-secondary education expenses. Some clubs work directly with schools to aid students who may need winter clothing, shoes, or other items that their families are unable to provide. Safety is a concern to Rotarians: lots of bicycle helmets are distributed around the District. In conjunction with the helmet distribution, bicycle safety classes are often included in the helmet project. Building everything from wheelchair ramps to city parks can be found on clubs' lists of projects. Rotarians are planters, too; flowers and trees are beautifying many of the District 5610 communities. Timeliness is important to Rotarians, judging by the Rotary clocks I've seen. Continuing to support all those projects year after year is also part of the clubs' commitments. Seeing Rotary wheels all over the District makes it clear that Rotary is involved.

...and more Projects—Internationally!

But more than the community projects, District 5610 is also involved internationally—in places that are not visible to us. People in Honduras are getting clean water; disaster victims are getting shelter boxes, Haitians can cook hot meals with a solar oven, people with disabilities in Romania, Vietnam, and Guatemala are more mobile because of wheelchairs.

Come to Madison! Attend the District 5610 Conference September 13–14, 2013


