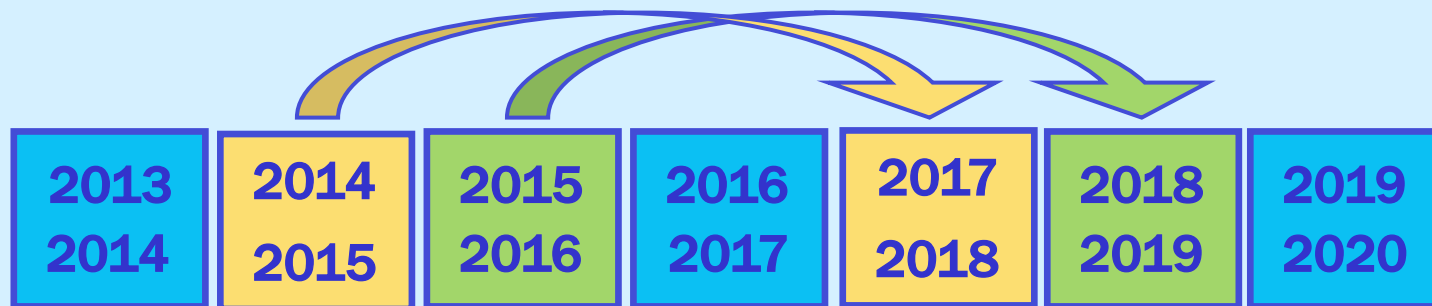

The SHARE System

(What is it, How it works)

Annual Fund – SHARE works in a 3-year cycle:



- Funds from the Annual Fund are available to districts 3 years after they are contributed - through SHARE
- For example:
 - Contributions made in 2014-15 are available now
 - Contributions made in 2015-16 are available in 2018-19

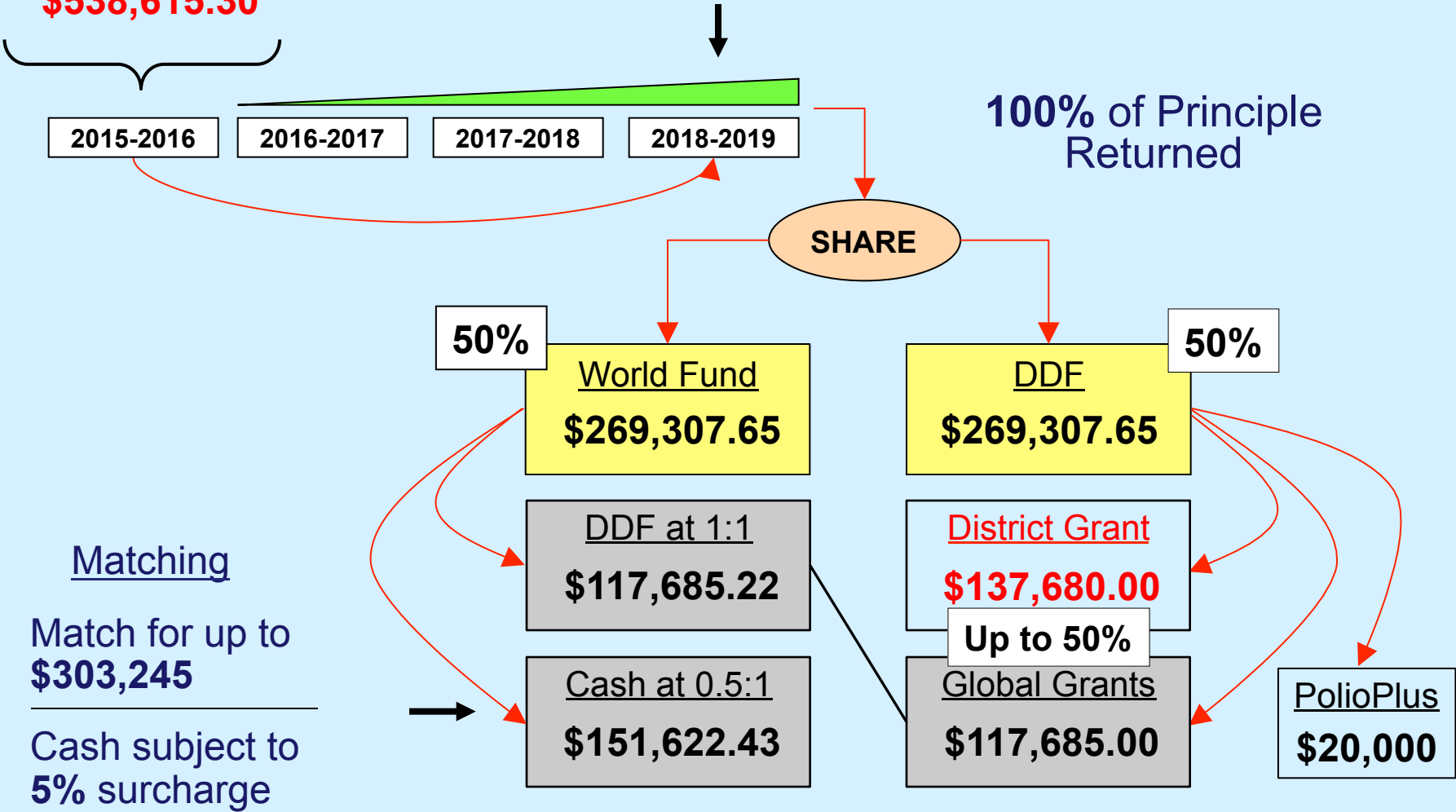

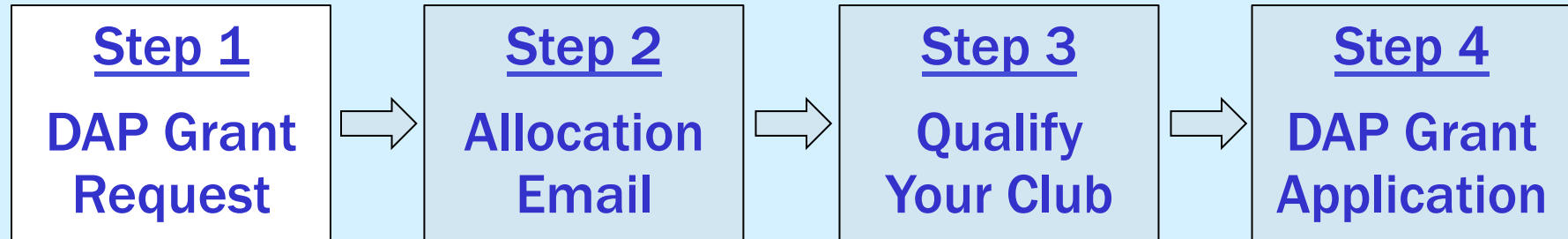

**** Can be increased if your club (1) has a strong 5-year per capita giving history and (2) you agree to attain at least a \$100 per capita in 2018-19**

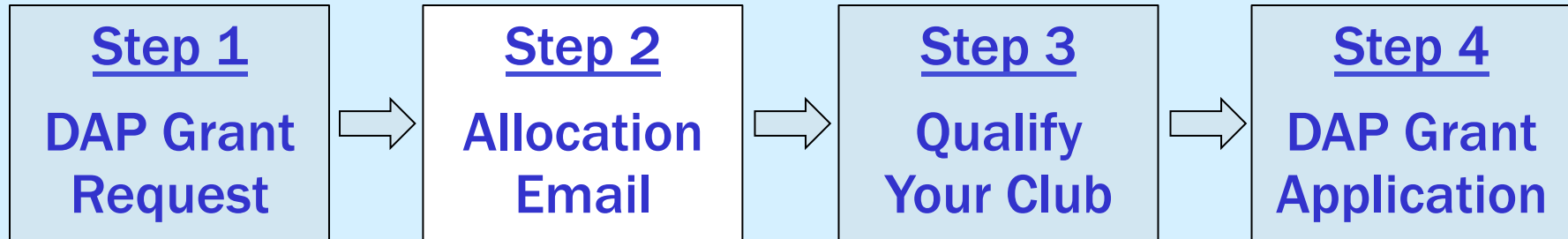
The DAP Grant Process



- Your Pre-Authorized Amount (PAA) is guaranteed if (1) your club is qualified and (2) the project is approved
- Provide a short (2 or 3 sentence) description of the project and specify how much money you are requesting
- Approval of amounts above your PAA will be based on (1) your club's 5-year per capita average and (2) your agreement to set a minimum \$100 per capita goal

Your request is due to DRFC Christine Kempff no later than the District Assembly (April 14th).

The DAP Grant Process

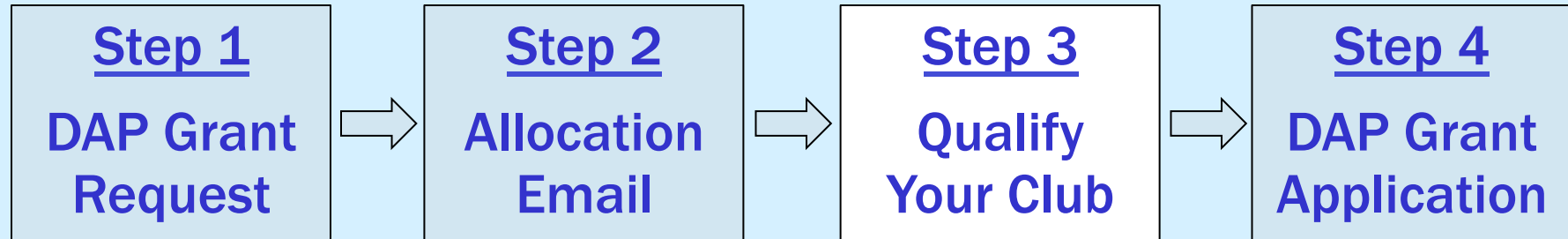


- This provides your actual DAP Grant funding award and copies of the following documents:

 - **Guidelines for the Eligibility of DAP Grant Expenditures**
 - **The 2018-19 District 5870 District Grant Policy**

Will be sent to Club Presidents-elect on or about June 1st

Be sure to read both the Eligibility Guidelines and Grant Policy before you start the Grant Application

The DAP Grant Process



- Sign and submit the 2018-19 MOU
- Submit your club's IRS Form 990 for the year ending June 30, 2017
- Ensure that you (PE) and one other club member are Grant Management certified ... it's a yearly requirement
- Pay both your club's district and RI dues
- Be current on all grant reporting requirements

Grant Management Training Seminar

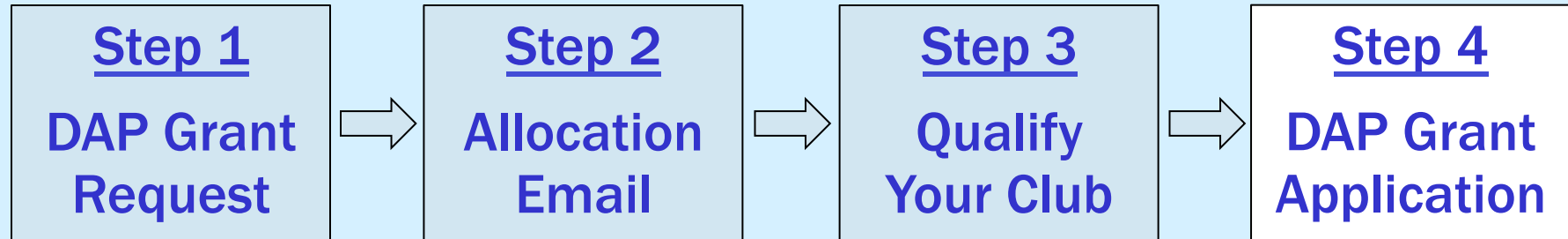
Training dates and venues:

- March 4 – at DFW Hyatt Regency (on Sunday during 2018 Lone Star P.E.T.S.) (3-hr full training only)
- March 24 – at Georgetown Community Rooms (both)
- April 14 – at the District Assembly (1-hr refresher only)
- April 28 – at Temple College (both)
- May 26 – at Georgetown Community Rooms (both)

Grant Management Training is an annual requirement.

If a member attended training in 2017, he or she is eligible to attend the 1-hour refresher class in 2018. If not, that person must attend the full 3-hour class.

The DAP Grant Process



- Provide your detailed project plan:
 - Describe what will be done, where it will take place, and who will benefit – must be completed NLT April 30, 2019
 - It must document active, hands-on Rotarian involvement, your project cannot be a cash donation
 - Detailed budget and financing plans are required
