Then, please attach, in one typewritten page or less, a narrative that addresses and explains why the nominee deserves this award, with attention to the following:

1. The nominee's skills and how they have been used to "pay it forward" to benefit employees or co-workers, members of the community, young people, or other Rotarians.
2. Specific examples of projects or activities in which the nominee had significant leadership or involvement.
3. Examples of educational programs or mentoring where the nominee had significant leadership or involvement.
4. Describe how the nominee has promoted the Rotary Vocational Service Ideals to fellow Rotarians.
