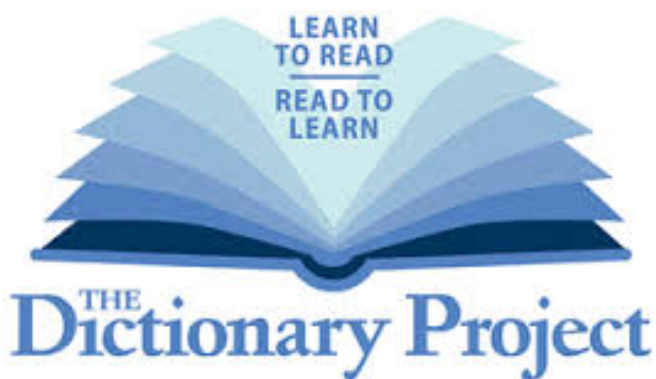

The Rotary Club of Waikiki. This club continued its Rotary Readers' program at Waikiki Elementary School where we read books to kindergarten students each month. Kindergartens can understand more than just the plot of a story. They are able to extend their thinking and discuss why events happened and why characters acted as they did. They can also make reasonable predictions about what will happen next and relate the story events to events in their own lives. Being able to discuss stories they listen to now will help children make meaning later on when they are able to read independently.
