Club Service Narrative for the Rotary Club of: Ala Moana

Club's Strategic Plan: The Club held its first Board meeting for the 2017-18 term on July 11, 2017. At that time, each board member shared their plan in their respective area noting budgetary requirements, human resources needs, and other expertise prerequisites in order to execute in the year.

Club Assemblies: The Club scheduled three assemblies for the 2017-18 term. Two of them took place in 2017 in July and November. And, the third one will take place in 2018 in late March. During the club assemblies, a "state of Club" is shared regarding the health of the club in the areas of membership, Avenues of Service, as well as re-visit the Club's strategic plan.

Coordination of Meeting Speakers: The Club has on its Board a Guest Speaker Chair who is responsible for reaching out to Club Members to identify guest speakers and topics that are of interest to the Club. Club Members are also reminded weekly during the Club Meetings in which the upcoming guest speakers are announced in "Speaker LineUp" segment. This acts as a reminder each week for Club Members to help the Guest Speaker Chair line up guest speakers especially if there are gaps in the lineup of speakers.

Fellowships: The Club had more than four fellowship activities so far in 2017-18 term which marks the Club's 45th anniversary. There were three fellowship activities to celebrate this milestone which included our four Sister Clubs: Rotary Club of Abiko (Japan), Rotary Club of Feng Yuan (Taiwan), Rotary Club of Hiroshima Jounan (Japan), and Rotary Club of Osaka Southwest (Japan). The Club kicked of the celebration with a golf outing followed by a Welcome Party with a "Taste of Hawaii" theme on July 28, 2017. Then, a formal dinner to wrap up the 45th anniversary celebration on July 29. In observance of Rotary Membership Month, the Club held a Pau Hana Networking event on August 31 where Club Members invited guest to network and to recruit as new members. To celebrate the holiday season, the Club held its Annual Holiday Celebration on December 7 at Leahi Concept Kitchen which supports the Kapiolani Community College's Culinary Arts promoting vocations in the restaurant field. In 2018 thus far, we held an annual dinner with a visiting Sister Club (Rotary Club of Osaka Southwest) on March 3, 2018.

Club Fundraiser Event: The Club's annual fundraiser event is an all-you-can-eat Dungeness crab event held in April. For the 2017-18 term, the Crab Fest will be held on April 21, 2018. The event sells out with the majority of tickets sales done by Club Members.

New Club Members, New Female Club Members, Membership Directory, and D5000 ClubRunner: The Club is fortunate to have **grown its membership by five new members** in the 2017-18 term so far. New members are added to ClubRunner as soon as their membership has been approved and an induction ceremony is scheduled. New members are immediately immersed into the Club with assigned roles in the weekly club meetings giving them the opportunity to get to know Club Members as the Greeter of the Day, presenting Inspiration, and leading the Club in the Pledge of Allegiance, Introduction of Guests and the Rotary Four-Way Test. With this year being 30 years of women in Rotary, the Club is fortunate to **add two new female members in the first half of this 2017-18 term**. The **Membership Directory in ClubRunner** is kept top of minder frequently during the weekly club meetings as it is the source for our monthly birthday and club anniversary celebrations. A demo of the **ClubRunner app** was presented at two club meetings to show Club Members that the directory is always accessible to everyone.

Club Service Narrative for the Rotary Club of Hanalei Bay

No one wants to miss one of our meetings and when they get there, they never want to leave. The view of Hanalei Bay in the background and the royalty of the St Regis Hotel adds to the charm of our meetings and the fellowship that encompasses the atmosphere. All members and guest are greeted at the door by our "welcomers". Each member has a chance to perform this duty. Once inside they can sit and watch a large screen event of all that Rotary does for our community and see themselves at work. After celebrating the opening of our meeting, Birthdays and Anniversaries are celebrated once a month along with the Rotarian of The Month Award whose cherished gift may be A Golden Hoe, A golden Keyboard or Golden Pluckers. Happy Bucks are also a fun part of the meeting. The guest speakers are the highlight of the meeting and are carefully chosen and coordinated by a member of our club whose whole job is provide us with a wealth of information about our community. We gladly pay for their lunches and they are willing to stay after the meeting to answer all questions. All visiting Rotarians take part in the meeting telling us of their Fundraisers of the year. During the meeting we also have fun auctions like a toilet light that raised \$500 for Polio, a Shark Hat that raised \$100 and a 4 ft robot that sold for \$100. The fun does not stop here but continues with Fellowship parties throughout the year. From a picnic in the park where we discussed serious matter on floaties, a Christmas Party, A super Bowl party, A tour of the Historical Museum and a Cinco De Mayo party. One meeting we substituted CPR classes and AED training and trained our Rotarians. Once a month we are out on the highway cleaning all the debris.

Our **two major fundraisers** are The Black and White Ball held at the St Regis which raised \$29,000 and our Annual Greatest Garage Sale Ever which raised over \$8,000. We had great coverage by the local newspaper and on our club app.

We inducted **7 new members and one Honorary member** whose Rotarian husband had passed away.

Our Japanese Sister Club came to visit with 21 people and were treated to a tour of the Kilauea Agricultural Garden where they **purchased trees** last year. We then treated them to a **sailing tour** of the Napali Coast.

Eight members of the club joined Nalani Flynn at **High Tea** and 7 members had **dinner with Steve Solomon** when he visited Kauai.

Our two main projects this year are the **Heart of Gold Campaign** which we are distributing 50 AEDs throughout the island of Kauai and the training of CPR and AED usage. The second is to help with the Funding of **the Kilauea Agricultural Park** with the construction of the Farmer Market buildings. We built a \$35,000 gazebo for the community to celebrate on the property.

We also had a **Clothing Swap** where women donated their clothing and all were invited to find treasures among the hangers. After wine and appetizers, the donations flowed in raising over \$1000 and **Small Change for A Big Change** where all Rotarians brought in their pocket change and we had a fun party counting all the coins. We raised over \$1300 with this fundraiser and both of these proceeds went to Polio. We also joined the District Fundraiser and rode our bikes and raised over \$1000.

Club Service Narrative for the Rotary Club of: Honolulu

Walk into any of our Club's luncheon meetings and you'll experience much of the essence of Rotary. You'll be greeted with a handshake and a smile by at least two greeters. As you walk towards the luncheon area, you may hear the soulful music of our Mele Rotarians, a group of members who love to sing and play ukulele. One of our members always hands out a bunch of lei to people, while another distributes his home-grown puakenikeni flowers to members who need a little fragrance in their lives that day. In all, fully 10 percent of our 160 members play some role in each well-run luncheon meeting. We start on time and end on time, but we always make time for informal fellowship during our hour-long program. If we hear a member is seriously ill, we'll pass around get-well-soon cards for everyone to sign. We have a member open every meeting with a two-minute inspiration, and the theme often revolves around why they love Rotary and its emphasis on service to community. A printed form is on each table to sign up for the next community-service project, and a Rota-Reminder note at each table can be brought home so members know of the next few service projects, luncheon speakers, and dates for the Club's Board and Foundation Trustee meetings; our weekly Tradewind e-newsletter to members also lists future projects and contains an encouraging message from the President. At each meeting you'll experience laughter, friendship, and a good feeling that no matter how beaten up you can be by other events during the rest of your day, this luncheon is an opportunity to feel hopeful about humanity and to be inspired by humble community leaders who love to give back.

This year, we launched several innovations to increase member engagement and satisfaction with our Club and to improve recruitment of new members. We reduced the cost of Rotary for members by holding only three meetings a month; the fourth meeting is a pau hana or a Paul Harris week lunch or dinner at the office or home of a member. Members under age 35 pay less to join our Club, and members who recruit up to five new members during the year get their dues waived for the following year. We started a Beer Club, have gathered twice at Aloha Beer Company, and became the nonprofit sponsor of the inaugural Hawaii Beer Fest, which is expected to draw 3,000 people to Bishop Museum's Great Lawn on June 16 to enjoy craft beers (we see this as a great opportunity to recruit new members). Our annual Halloween costume contest is hilarious, and our holiday caroling night warms the hearts of patients at the Shriners Hospital, residents at Arcadia, and mothers and children at the YWCA Fernhurst Residence (this year we rented two trolleys to take the Fernhurst families to see the Honolulu City Lights). In other words, we have fun together in many different ways.

We've also innovated in the areas of service and speakers. Recognizing that not everyone likes to pound nails or paint walls, we created several new types of service projects so that we can meet the different interests and skill sets of each member. For example, we adopted a plot in Maunalua Bay where we wade out to remove alien invasive algae. We started a project along with our HPU Rotaract club to serve meals once a quarter to homeless individuals at the Institute for Human Services. We committed to plant 160 trees this year, and have planted 126 so far, at Palama Settlement, Fernhurst, and Kahauiki Village. We have a group of members who read to children at Kuhio Park Terrace and Mayor Wright homes. We rebuild schools and storm-ravaged community facilities in the Philippines each March. We're launching a new project in April to mentor young men released from prison. And we're taking the lead in building a much-needed park in Waikiki for local residents; we've raised \$429,000 so far, about \$300,000 of which was raised this Rotary Year. And we've built a very close relationship with the YWCA Fernhurst residence, doing a major Weinberg Friends project there on September 23, 2017 that involved 39 of our members to build them a garden, repaint walls, and provide picnic tables covered in artwork designed by one of the work-furloughed residents.

We created a new speaker series, called "The View from the Kama'aina C-Suite," which has been a great draw for prospective members. CEOs/COOS from G70, Bank of Hawaii, Foodland, Hawaiian TelCom, Grove Farms, Island Insurance, Hawaiian Airlines, and C.S. Wo, have all come to be interviewed by our President, Oprah-style, on how they use their values to adapt and thrive in an increasingly competitive world.

Club Service Narrative for the Rotary Club of: HONOLULU SUNSET

Club Service is the lifeblood of the club. We incorporate all of our areas of service into our weekly meetings and publish a newsletter to members, past members, guest speakers and general public weekly to report on activities and inform everyone about upcoming events.

We have Greeters who welcome members, guests and the speaker. An "Ambassador" is assigned to welcome visiting Rotarians, especially those who come from another country or out of state.

<u>Strategic Planning.</u> We began our year with a **board retreat**. Prospective projects and goals were reviewed. Input from all members was considered in project planning. **Monthly board meetings** review our progress on projects and report back to the membership. The **By-Laws** of our club were reviewed, updated and voted upon by our membership. Our goal is to keep the club alive and active in all avenues of service.

Joint Meetings/Projects. Every effort is made to attract support from our UH Rotaract Club in addition to cooperating with other Rotary clubs. The **Ala Wai cleanup** project paired Sunset Rotarians with UH Rotaract members and Waikiki Yacht Club members to clean up the Ala Wai Harbor and shoreline. We have supported the **Langley Ukulele Ensemble** for the past 12 years by holding a **joint session** at Dave & Busters along with *Pau Hana Rotary Club*. Several other clubs had members in attendance. **Ride So That They Can Walk** provided a project to raise funds for **Polio Plus** while incorporating support from our UH Rotaract Club. **The Century Bike Ride** assisted another community fundraising project by providing an aide stations staffed by Sunset Rotarians and UH Rotaract students. **The Aloha Medical Mission Dental Clinic** painting project provided an event incorporating Sunset Rotarians, UH Rotaract, Pau Hana, several other Rotary Club members and our Community Corps Men's Shed. Sunset Rotary **partnered with a private company** to provide supplies for two homes in **Kahauiki Village** as part of the D5000 project to supply household items for these homes designed to assist homeless families get back on their feet.

<u>Cinco De Mayo Fundraising</u> Our fundraising project had to be rescheduled from the February timeframe because the venue was still under construction. This year's theme was chosen to give new life to our efforts. Honolulu Sunset is always the leader in D5000 RI donations which requires us to raise funds every year to match RI grant money. This project has 100% participation by Sunset Rotarians.

<u>Guest Speakers</u> Our speaker committee consistently seeks interesting and varied speakers. Speakers received a book that they can sign, which is donated to Jefferson Library. Every effort is made to attract speakers in areas related to our community and international service interests. Several "offsite" meetings were held as we were required by the Waikiki Yacht Club to change our meeting day from Thursday to Monday and then back again to Thursday. The offsite meetings provided variety and took advantage of several Condo activity rooms for a change of pace. These off-site meetings provided fellowship outside of the normal meeting space at the Waikiki Yacht Club.

<u>*Fellowship Activities*</u> Honolulu Sunset Rotary traditionally begins the Rotary Year with a **cook out** at the home of one of our club Rotarians on or about the 4th of July. This well attended event celebrates the year just concluded and shows support for our new President and Board. Our Holiday party at Christmas was held offsite on December 6th this year at a condo party room and was well attended. A vocational fellowship was held on December 13th at JABSOM to meet with the UH staff and students who work on the H.O.M.E. van, providing free medical care to the homeless on Oahu. March found our members participating in a painting class for fourteen people held at the recreation center in a member's private community. This was followed by a potluck and social.

We recognize members' birthdays with their own special cupcake and candle and sing "Happy Birthday." Community events and projects are followed by fellowship.

Our Club Administration program works off a design that has worked successfully for us since our move to Mulligan's on the Blue in 2008-09. Our aim is to involve all member in committee and club activities. One member of the Club Administration/Club Service Committee is responsible for assigning Club Duties, assigned randomly and posted on our website and emailed to assignees. The Speaker Chair is responsible for recruiting speakers and placing PSAs in the Maui News.

For the first time, our club introduced "Keiki Dental" to our 2 elementary schools.

One of our best fellowship events, on March 2nd, was reading Dr. Seuss books, in celebration of Dr. Seuss birthday at Kihei Elementary School. Our members were there to help. It has been decided to make this an annual project for our club.

We also support the District Literacy Project with distribution dictionary distributions at Kamalii School, Kihei elementary and Kihei charter school.

Our aim is to involve all members in committee and club activities. The Club Service and Programs Committee are responsible for recruiting weekly guest speakers and promoting member interaction through various club and inter-club activities.

We have placed a focus on this last years' club speakers to include prominent business executives and influential leaders in Hawaii businesses and organizations, providing our members great value in delivering an opportunity for education, but also high-level networking.

Club weekly duties are assigned to members on a voluntary basis, and it works great for our club! We also encourage our Rotaracts to participate in this, as it's a great way to get involved and make their presence felt.

Ongoing club activities include: recognition of Rotarians celebrating birthdays, holiday activities, random 5-minute timeouts for fellowship, "Happy Dollars" which is a time set aside where a Rotarian can announce something positive (professional or personal- from having a new grandchild to getting a promotion), and weekly interaction with guest speakers during the question/answer period, where we pass around a microphone and get to ask questions regarding what our speakers taught us.

Activities that extended beyond weekly meetings have included:

- In August 2017, we hosted a Family Fun Day at Coral Crater. The day was a wonderful team building activity that was not only for members, but for their families. - On January 25th, 2018, the club organized a walking tour of Chinatown's Red Light District based on it's history during World War II. The tour provided historical information on not only the "Red Light" scene, but of that time period in general, including notes on street names and historical buildings / architecture.

- On February 12th, 2018, we hosted a Valentines Day dinner for club members and spouses as well as guests, a great time for fellowship, and for seeing a personal side of fellow Rotarians.

- We have utilized a custom-made club app for a mobile devices to send out info and invitations for upcoming activities. We have also placed weekly program / speaker info and events info on the Calendar on the app, so it provides easy access for everyone to see and participate.
