Club Service Narrative for the Rotary Club of: POIPU BEACH

It was important to President Milani and the 2017-2018 Board that Rotary Club of Poipu Beach strengthened its club by improving operations and weekly meetings, fun activities, becoming more involved with the four other clubs on island.

In club operations and weekly meetings, President Milani created a practice where members would begin the weekly club meeting by reciting the Four Way Test and explaining it to any non-Rotarians attending. During her first meeting a club president, President Milani explained to the club that in order to model the way as Rotarians, it is important to not only put our actions to test using the Four Way Test, but to exhibit it each week when the club meets as a wonderful way to start the day and keep in mind the Four Way Test as we interact during the meeting.

Another practice that was put into place in an effort of providing clear communication, was sending in advance an agenda for the weekly club meeting which would reflect special recognitions (birthdays, wedding anniversaries, Rotary anniversaries, work achievements); information on club business; special announcements; speaker information. In addition, the club also started holding one club assembly per month to keep members informed of board member actions, club business, and district information.

What has also helped improve operations was the addition of a customized Rotary Club of Poipu Beach app for mobile devices. This app is similar in structure to Facebook and provides a way for club members to communicate internally and celebrate all things Rotary and events that are important to our members. It enables easy messaging and phone calls at the touch of a button. Many members have expressed their satisfaction with the app after having had a series of brief trainings at our weekly meetings and monthly assemblies.

Speaker recruitment was once a cumbersome task, but the process has become much smoother due to assigning board members the responsibility to solicit speakers. Board members are encouraged to engage the club members when possible.

Our fellowship activities this year have been wonderful. On 8/23/17, we had a Pin Ball Pau Hana at Kauai Island Brewery and Grill. It was a fun afternoon where members could relax and talk story over beer, pupu, and pinball. On 10/18/17, we held an event called Raise a Glass to End Polio where members and friends came to Merriman's to have fun at pau hana time and sip delicious craft beer while raising money to end polio. 11/4/17 was our annual Harvest Moon BBQ and potluck. It was a great evening at CJM Stables in Poipu as our club members, family, and friends got to know one another while grilling steaks and talking story. We even were able to witness our club member's rodeo crew in action while prepping for the event. On 12/9/17 our newest member Michelle and a small committee organized our annual progressive holiday party. 3 members hosted the club at their homes, starting with pupu, moving on to main entrees, and concluding with dessert.
