New: Books 4 Samoa Project

In the summer of 2017 RCKS implemented a new project: Books 4 American Samoa and delivered over 30,000 school and library books to American Samoa. This new project was an outgrowth of the "Books 4 Kids" program.

Our partner in the Books 4 American Samoa project this year was the 1st Lady of American Samoa, Mrs. Cynthia M. Moliga and the Rotary Club of Pago Pago. We are also in the process of implementing a Sister Club relationship with the Rotary Club of Pago Pago. Coincidentally, Mrs. Moliga was born here in Honolulu and graduated from Chaminade University. Prior to moving to American Samoa, she served as a teacher in Hawaii, New Jersey, New York and Puerto Rico. It was this love of teaching and helping children that drew her to partnering with us on this project. Improving literacy is also the First Lady 's key area of focus.

Background information on the Books 4 Kids program:

It began in 2013 with a shipment of about 800 books to a small island off the north east coast of Mindanao, in the south of the Philippines. Shortly after that, typhoon Yolanda tore through the central Philippines destroying more then 4,500 classrooms & libraries. Recognizing the enormous need, our club focused on collecting books being displaced by the roll out of Common Core here in Hawaii. We shifted gears and went from processing a few hundred books a month, to processing about 5,000 to 8,000 a month. Without this project, those same books would have gone to landfill or power generation.

"Books 4 Kids "became a true community effort with volunteers coming from most of the west side Rotary clubs, Interacters, the military and countless friends & neighbors. And, because of the support of local businesses the project was completed for under \$10,000.00.

With this new and final project, "Books 4 Kids " program has delivered over 150,000 books to many hundreds of schools and libraries in the Philippines and in American Samoa. Over the next few years those books will be used by hundreds of thousands of children, that most need the benefit of education and print materials to support literacy.

Polio Plus:

RCKS members participated in The Ride So They Can Walk, raising hundreds of dollars for Polio Plus.

RCKS has taken the lead on the District 5000 Conference Walk to End Polio and has secured Four Seasons sponsorship for the event, including breakfast, a baseball cap and a drawing for a Naupaka Spa gift certificate.

RCKS members will also register on site, supervise the walk way and serve as breakfast hosts.

In addition, RCKS members have already registered for the walk, which will raise hundreds of dollars for Polio Plus.

Rotary Club of Lahaina International Service

On February 2017, we traveled to Tacloban City, Leyte, Philippines to dedicate two newly constructed clean water systems that the Rotary Club of Lahaina and Rotary Club of Lahaina, Sunset funded. Joining us to dedicate the Clean Water System for Lorenzo Daa Memorial Elementary School and Camansihay Elementary School were Rotary Club of Paco, Manila – District 3810 and Rotary Club of Tacloban – District 3860, and both Sisters Clubs of the Rotary Club of Lahaina.

At the dedication of the Clean Water Tank for Lorenzo Daa Memorial Elementary School, I asked the Principal of the school that if he knows of any school that also needs clean water, to have the Principal email me about their school and its current water system.

On March 27, 2017, I received an email from Mr. Rizaleo Pamor, Principal of Santa Elena Elementary School requesting for assistance for the school and the village for clean water. According to Mr. Pamor, their current water source comes directly from a weir. Further, due to Hurricane Haiyan, some of the tanks were destroyed and was never replaced and in some instances by 10am, the village does not have access to water.

Upon receiving Mr. Pamor's email, I immediately reached out to other Rotary Clubs, civic organizations, friends and family members. Within four months I was able to raise the necessary funds of \$15,000 to construct a 6,000+ liter tank that will provide clean water for the 1,300+ people of Barangay Santa Elena and the 210+ students of Santa Elena Elementary School.

Five Districts and eight Rotary clubs worked together to complete the project within five months. Rotary clubs, who contributed their time, talent and treasure to complete this project were:

Rotary Club of Calgary, South - District 5360 (Canada); Rotary Club of Grover Beach – District 5240 (California); Rotary Club of Kapolei – District 5000; Rotary Club of Lahaina, Sunrise – District 5000; Rotary Club of Upcountry Maui – District 5000; Rotary Club of Paco Manila – District 3810; Rotary Club of Tacloban – District 3860

On the first week of July 2017, Director Mark Hilhorst of the Rotary Club of Tacloban, volunteered to oversee the project and ensure of its completion.

On August 26, 2018, Rotarians from Rotary Club of Lahaina, Rotary Club of Kapolei and Rotary Club of Upcountry Maui, traveled to Santa Elena, Tacloban City, Leyte, Philippines to dedicate the newly constructed clean water system.

At the dedication ceremony, Mr. Pamor commented that it was a shot in the dark. They expected to have a 2,000 liter tank, similar to the other two schools and maybe it will be constructed sometime in 2018. Thanks to Rotary, we delivered far more than what everyone in Santa Elena expected.

To ensure that the clean water system is sustainable and in working condition and secured at all times, the system was built on the school grounds and to have the school Principal, the PTSA President and the Village Captain be responsible in maintaining and securing the clean water system 24/7.

Our Club Member Lyman Morikawa joined the Rotary Club of Lahaina twice as they went to the Philippines providing water systems and other projects. They were greeted by local Rotarians, taken around to the communities and helping schools and other groups. They took school supplies with them in August and clothing in January. My favorite story is when they were at a school in the Philippines and the principal was proud of the school but showed them the steep drop-off and how concerned she was about the student's safety. One of Maui Rotarians asked what it would cost to build a fence, she said \$80 – he pulled \$80 out of his wallet and handed it to her. Another Maui Rotarian handed her a \$50 bill and told her to build a better fence. Another member of the group handed her \$40 and told her to put in a gate. She was crying tears of joy and appreciation – I think our Rotarians were too. There is always the question – as we travel and change the lives of others, our lives are changed even more so.

Carly Heims spearheaded our Ride So They Can Walk Polio Fundraiser. She collected pledges as she rode 100 miles the week of November 11 - 18. She was able to collect donations of \$2005 through RCUM Club member's donation, as well as donations from friends, family and coworkers. She brought a stationary bike to the Makawao 3^{rd} Friday celebration – bringing the issue to many people attending the Makawao Town Party as she rode a few of her 100 miles.

Club member Murray Visser and spouse Brigitte Visser represented RC Windward Oahu at Dr. James Ham's fund raiser on 26 August 2017. The fund raiser collected money for humanitarian missions for WASH (water, sanitation and hygiene) and other health initiatives. The mission improved the lives of people in the rural highlands of Papua New Guinea.

RC Windward Oahu contributed towards Dr. James Ham's Global Grant 1862877 for Improved Access to Safe Water and Water Sanitation & Hygiene Education in Nepal. The RC Windward Oahu's Global Grant allocation was \$ 778.33, which came to a total of \$ 2,725.90 because of the District's and TRF's matching funds. The Team consists of eight Rotarians who have knowledge in diverse areas such as: writing Global Grants, Water and Sanitation, the Friendship Exchange Program, the Open World Program, Economic and Community Development, Peace Corps/Rotary Partnerships, Sustainability (maintenance), the Foundation, and more. The Team's purpose is to support the clubs in District 5000 in doing international service projects with a number of countries such as: Russia, Ecuador, Morocco, Ukraine, and more.
