INTERNATIONAL SERVICE

- **GG1988399 - Chunder Drinking Water Project** - \$75K. Fourteen D5000 contributing club payments, D5000 cash contributions (earthquake relief fund) and the local host club in Nepal already made the payments and all the contribution was sent to the TRF grant management center, Chicago. This grant will provide clean drinking water to 120 families who now have to hike over 4 hours to fetch drinking water.
- **GG2117300 - Equipping a High-Care Unit in Dhading Hospital, Nepal.** RCHS is the international host for this grant and RC Narayangarh is the local host in Nepal. Our club contributed \$1000 for this project of a total budget of \$54,656.00. Eight other clubs from D5000 and their DDF, three clubs from Taiwan and their DDF and two clubs from Nepal have contributed to fund this project. This Global Grant will provide Emergency Room and ICU equipment such as a ventilator. Over 45 Health posts and health centers feed into this remote hospital which serves over 250k people. This is the only hospital designated by the Government of Nepal to manage Covid-19 in this district. For more information about the project, please contact our international service director Paul Moroz.
- **GG2118290 - Improving Basic Education in Nepal.** The "Centerpiece" **District International Service Project.** District 5000 is the lead international sponsor. This global grant aims to reduce gender-based and caste-based disparities by improving basic and applied science education at two rural high schools in Damauli, a remote region of Nepal. Total budget \$45K+ is fully committed. Ten D5000 Clubs committed (including UH Manoa Rotaract). D5000 Rotarians will have opportunity to visit the schools and get involved hands-on in several different components.
- Kumari Community Hospital, Nepal GG 1752052 (Outside D5000). This global grant will provide medical equipment to outfit a brand new hospital (already built) that will serve a rural community of 100K+ with no hospital within a 30 mile radius. The hospital will become a COVID-19 management center. Lead International Sponsor is RC Mumbai Cuffe Parade (India) Total Budget \$240K+ Grant is already approved, pending funding. Three D5000 clubs have committed. Opportunity for Rotarians to visit during their service trip.
- Bhutan Wilderness Medicine VTT, Bhutan Global Grant GG2098429. This train-the-trainer grant provides life-saving wilderness medical training to Bhutanese trekking guides to treat their own families and rural village communities as well as the tourists that provide their income source. RC Honolulu Sunset is the lead club (RY 20-21, \$33K+ total) Three D5000 clubs committed. Grant is pending approval due to COVID-19 travel restrictions of the VTT Team of world-renowned experts from the University of Utah, with anticipated travel dates in Oct-Nov. Opportunity for Rotarians to help facilitate training and hand deliver equipment and other items.

Other active Global Grants:

- **GG 1979882 Malamulo (Malawi) Catchment Area Water Protection** - Our Club's Global Grant targets Malamulo Hospital as the only facility serving the health needs in the Thyolo District and outlying watershed. During the rainy season, deforested rocky and steep geography in the area enhance extreme runoff rates which, in turn, cause serious water contamination and lead to poor health outcomes, especially in young children. Community involvement established that protecting these water sources for the benefit of watershed residents, especially the Malamulo Hospital, is a top priority. This need is addressed by this RCHS Global Grant.

In addition:

- President Ary facilitated a Russian Friendship Exchange virtual event with participation from Rotarians from Russia and the mainland. Rotarians from RCHS did a demonstration on a popular local delicacy in Hawaii. We shared and exchanged information on cultural and traditional activities.
- Past President James, PE Arjun Aryal and RCHS International Director, Paul Moroz participate in D5000's International Committee. They are part of the planning for the Nepal service project scheduled for October, 2021.
- RCHS supported Peace Initiatives in Hawaii - had a speaker from the Matsinaga Peace Institute to talk about Peace and Conflict Resolution. RCHS sponsored and is supporting a "Peer Mediation" Peace Conference for local youth.
- RCHS had a speaker who was RCHS Ambassadorial Scholar, who joined the Peace Corps and came to share her experience with the club.

PRESENTATION OF GLOBAL GRANT AT A CLUB MEETING: Dr. Kawser Ahmed from the Rotary Club of Winnipeg was our virtual speaker at our club meeting on Tuesday September 15, 2020. Dr. Ahmed outlined the details of the Global Grant project (see above) that we participated in and provided funding.

OTHER-MEETING SPEAKERS WITH INTERNATIONAL CONTENT: Jon Kaufman from Project H2Open Doors was our meeting speaker on November 17, 2020. This project began as a Global Grant and now provides water technology and has demonstrated that opportunities are created when the poor start small enterprises with bottling plants installed by the project. Deidre Teagarden, the Director of the Nisei Veterans Memorial Center, was a meeting speaker on March 16, 2021. Her presentation “ The Nisei Veterans, their Legacy Lives On” provided us with interesting information and history about this only brick and mortar Nisei center in the Hawaiian islands.

SISTER CLUB RELATIONSHIP: Plans were in the works to host up to 35 members and guests of our Sister Club, the Rotary Club of Yamato Mahoroba Japan, for 3 days here on Maui following the RI Convention. Unfortunately, due to the pandemic and cancellation of the Convention in Honolulu, these plans will definitely be scheduled for another time when it is safe to travel.

CLUB MEMBERS SIGNED UP FOR NEPAL PROJECT VISIT: As of this submission three members of our club have signed up to participate in the D5000 International Service Trip to Nepal scheduled for October 25-29, 2021. A unique part of this project is the addition of the planting of mango trees which our club member, Mariko Higashi, will help orchestrate with the project organizers.

International Service Narrative for Rotary Club of **HONOLULU SUNRISE**

- 1. Thailand Global Grant #2117555:** For the past 8 years, we have been blessed to work with the Rotary Club Silom (Dist. 3350) in Bangkok Thailand and PDG Kasemchai "Sam" Nitiwanakun. This particular Global Grant is to replace the lighting system within the Operating Room (OR) at Chiang Rai Hospital. This is a very Rural Hospital and their current lighting system is over 20 years old and is insufficient to handle any intricate operations. This global grant amounts to \$35,787 and it has been funded in less than six months. We are currently collecting the pledged funds and hope to have the new lighting system install by the end of this year.
- 2. Cambodia Aloha Learning Center School Supplies:** With the use of District Fund grant we have allocated funds for the purchase of school supplies for the children of this orphanage.
- 3. Thailand Hospital Global Grant #2093771:** This Global grant was started last year and involved the purchase of needed medical equipment for a rural hospital in Amnat Charoen Thailand. We were able to secure all the funding this year amounting to \$78,400 in funds from clubs in District 5000 and other clubs from Thailand and Southeast Asia. All the funds were sent to RI and the equipment was purchased and delivered to this rural community that sits on the Mekong River in Northeastern Thailand. This project was also sponsored by the Silom Rotary Club (Dist. 3350) in Bangkok Thailand.
- 4. Cambodia Aloha Learning Center Garden Project:** The Honolulu Sunrise Rotary club helped to fund the garden project for Cambodian children and young adults in need at our Aloha Learning Center in Phnom Penh. Sunrise Rotary members also continue to mentor these young Cambodian students via Zoom, email and other social media. Forty (40) young students who are preparing for and attending college in Cambodia are being supported by many of our Sunrise Club members on an ongoing basis.
- 5. Friendship with Atago Rotary Club in Tokyo:** For a number of years we have partnered with the Atago Rotary Club to bring blind and sight impaired young adults to Hawaii. This program has been very productive as it shows these individuals that losing their sight doesn't mean that they have to give up on their dreams. We have two Honolulu Sunrise members that are totally blind and they continue to inspire these young adults that are dealing with their blindness. Several of them have returned to Japan after their visit with a new perspective on life and have accomplished great things. They continue to visit us in Hawaii and communicate with our members that have stayed these individuals during their time in Hawaii.
- 6. Sister Rotary Club of Niigata Bandai:** We continue our Sister club relationship via Zoom and emails with the Rotary Club of Niigata Bandai. This year they produced a video congratulating our club on our 30th Anniversary.
