Our aim is to involve all members in committee and club activities. One member of the Club Administration/Club Service Committee is responsible for assigning Club Duties, assigned randomly and posted on our website and emailed to assignees. The Speaker Chair is responsible for recruiting speakers and placing PSAs in the Maui News.

One of our most successful innovations has been to take advantage of three flat screen monitors. With PC/HDMI projection, speaker's PowerPoints are high visible in our sunny meeting room, and more effective. This AV format (plus a wireless internet connection) gives on-screen access to our website, newsletters, and Facebook page allowing the Club Administration Chair to present recaps of Club activities during the past week and announcements of upcoming events on screen, while at the same time marketing the website and social media sites to Club members and our many guests.

One of our best fellowship events, on March 1st, was reading Dr. Seuss books, in celebration of Dr. Seuss birthday at Kihei Elementary School to 140 1st graders. More than 12 members were there to help. It has been decided to make this an annual project for our club.

We also support the District Literacy Project with dictionary distributions at Montessori Hale O Keiki, Kihei, Kamalii School, Kihei Elementary and Kihei charter school.

Increasingly, the Maui Clubs are cooperating in all-island events and projects. Beginning with the all-Island Presidents Induction in late June, Presidents and PEs meet monthly to coordinate projects and fundraisers: Maui RYLA, the Interact Workshop, Foundation Seminar, and Maui the District Assembly.

Narrative

The Rotary Club of Pearlridge has a scholarship program, which provides financial assistance to any Aiea High School and/or Pearl City High School student in financial need who is pursuing a post-secondary degree. Through this scholarship program, we have awarded two students with 4-year scholarships at \$2,000 a year (4-year total of \$8,000 for each student). This year we plan to award a 2-year, \$4,000 college scholarship this year to an Aiea High School or Pearl City High School student (\$2,000/year). Our club truly values extending the higher education opportunity to students in great financial need. This year, one of our newest members Gidget Ruschetta, Chief Operating Officer of Pali Momi Medical Center, graciously offered to host a meeting at the Pali Momi Diamond Head Conference Room in order to raise funds for our scholarship program. Each member and guest were charged a lunch fee of \$20, which went to our scholarship fund. In addition to any additional donations they wanted to make. Our speakers for the event were Dr Maria Ver, Trauma Surgeon and Matt Wells, RN provided a very informative and engaging overview of the Pali Momi Trauma Center and conveyed the importance of the work that Pali Momi Medical Center performs for the community. We are truly thankful to Gidget Ruschetta, the Pali Momi Medical Center Leadership and the rest of the Pali Momi Medical Center for their generosity and support in providing the excellent location, lunch, speakers, and center tour for our club in conjunction with Community Service Chair/President –Elect Lasar McCabe and Programs Chair Angel Ramos who helped coordinate the logistics for the event. We had 19 Rotary Club of Pearlridge members who attended the event in addition to 15 guests. This luncheon fundraiser produced \$2,339, which will help provide for needed current and future recipients of the Rotary Club of Pearlridge Scholarship. In addition, the Pali Momi Foundation raised \$400 for their great medical trauma work in the community.

The Rotary Club of Kona completed the following which I feel qualifies us for an award from District 5000.

At the beginning of my term we implemented our Strategic Plan that was created during my year as President elect. Implementation date was 07/30/2016. The board has also been active in monthly board meetings where we monitor our plan.

Harold Meltzer and James Resor coordinated to make sure we had a few year calendar of speakers.

We had several fellowship outings including, Manta Ray Dive where all proceeds were donated to polio plus, Christmas Party at Linda Jane Kelly's home, Mahalo Party at Old Airport Pavillion, following our week long fundraiser, and Club participation in Ironman Parade of Nations with a fellowship party held at King Kamehameha Beach Hotel.

Our Club fundraiser is the Mitsubishi Electric Championship PGA tour where we have over 400 volunteers from 1/17-/1/21. This year our club was awarded \$60, 500 for our participation and management of the volunteers. This tournament would not be possible without our club's participation.
