Our year started off in July with a community garage sale with all proceeds going towards our Polio Plus Giving. Members donated miscellaneous items they were not using but which were treasures to other individuals. With donations our Club has reached its goal for Polio Plus Donations of \$50 per capita. We met our Annual Fund-Share goals and have been advocating for member participation in our District Polio Plus Society.

Due to the Pandemic, virtual training with District 5000 became the easiest way to learn about the Foundation. From September through October, ending with “World Polio Day” on October 24th, our members got a thorough education in how the Foundation operates and how much good it does. Thank goodness for “Zoom” as a way to get the word to all.

The Foundation Chair has completed the Rotary.org Learning Center courses and reviewed and used the Rotary Foundation Reference Guide to answer any questions members might have. Our Foundation Chair sent out individual information packets regarding each member's Annual Foundation Giving. We maintained confidentiality with all member information. When a member contributed, they were recognized at a Club meeting with a “Certificate of Recognition”. The Foundation Chair completed all forms and maintained a spreadsheet of all members' giving status, as suggested by District Foundation Annual Giving Chair Rich Zegar, a speaker at our virtual meeting during Foundation month in November.

In December we raised money for Polio by doing a “Punch Out Polio” Pau Hana. RCK members bought tickets and got to punch out polio and claim the prize in their cup. It got a lot of attention at our virtual Pau Hana meeting. We viewed the on-site work of members who worked on different international projects, and talked about how we have only two countries left with wild polio (Afghanistan & Pakistan) and truly are “Just This Close” in eradication.
