The Rotary Club of Upcountry Maui is really excited about the completion of this project. Youth Encouragement Services of Uganda is run by a former resident of Upcountry Maui, Carol Adams. We've been doing small donations to Y.E.S. Uganda for years.

In 2020 we had Carol as a speaker at one of our meetings and afterwards we had a conversation about what projects RCUM could do to benefit the orphanage. It was decided that a new institutional style stove that uses solar power combined with wood would bring the biggest benefit. Carol sent us pictures of the installed stove! We are so happy for them. The stove is part of the vocational development center and at first will help provide lunch for the 40+ students and then will be used as part of their program to teach cooking and catering.

We are working with the district to setup a trip next year for 30 Rotarians to go to Uganda. She has expressed some needs and we are working hard to get the right people and resources available once we are able to travel again safely.
