The 4-Way Test is promoted at all meetings. We have vocational talks by all new members to promote their businesses. Due to Covid, we have not been able to conduct tours of member's businesses but through Zoom we have learned everyone's business background. During this Rotary year, we have conducted three Pau Hana events where we had a chance to enjoy fellowship and to plan to mutually support our Rotarians in their businesses and professions.

We have been actively involved for almost seven years in the Hawaii Literacy Adult Reading Program and will resume our ongoing Read-To-Me program at Ho'okele Elementary School by attending a virtual Read to Me in March. We have kept communications open with all of our supported schools, while keeping our members safe.

In October we awarded two scholarships in nursing and healthcare to graduate students in college this year. The four applicants were all so impressive that we awarded two additional scholarships through the generosity of one of our long-term members. These four scholarships were worth a total of \$8000, impressive for a small club.

We devoted a meeting for a vocational talk in February from our Club Trainer. His slides were especially meaningful, showing all past projects and how our life has adjusted to this Pandemic. The theme of our Rotarians continuing to support projects through their businesses and vocations was clear.

Lifeline Fire and Security, Inc. has participated as a sponsor in our 5K Virtual Run/Walk/Paddle and they have also participated in awarding dictionaries to Barbers Point Elementary School.

Sharon Har, State Representative for District 42, is an annual speaker at our club, and provides a comprehensive legislative update after each session. Kiran Polk, Executive Director of the Kapolei Chamber of Commerce, also keeps us well informed and involved in the business community.

It has been great for our members to learn about what some of our retired members used to do. They have become amazing mentors to the younger business members in our club.

Our lead membership chair, Frank Szczepanski, has created and organized our Monthly Skills Workshops. These occur twice a month on Wednesday at 4pm. There are three goals we wanted to accomplish with these Workshops.
