The Rotary Club of Upcountry Maui is in the progress of chartering a second Interact Club at Kamehameha. The paperwork is still being completed as of date but should be done before this Rotary year ends. We currently have an Interact club at King Kekaulike School. Initially we couldn't have them participate in any service projects because of social gathering rules by the school. Eventually we were able to setup some training classes that allowed social distancing and gave them an opportunity to learn Red Cross certified CPR/AED and first aid training and shelter setup training.

Our own Mary Albtiz worked relentlessly on the virtual RYLA program and Wendy Hornack was the technical facilitator for the first ever virtual JR RYLA. We had amazing turn out for both events and kids are excited to get back together and do it again. We couldn't be more pleased with the turnout. We had a couple of the RLYA kids come and present to our club as well for the members that couldn't make RYLA. They made slideshows and discussed their experiences. The JR RYLA group is meeting again and having a Toastmasters training.

We are providing a video for all our dictionaries for the 3rd graders upcountry so that when they get their dictionaries, they can also learn about Rotary and the Four Way Test. Normally we do a school presentation but with everything being virtual, we found this to be the best way for them to get their dictionaries and still learn about Rotary.

We have a program called Students of the Month where we have the teachers at Kamehameha and King Kekaulike provide us with students who they feel have stepped above and beyond. Once a month a new student comes to our meeting and discusses their senior project and college/career plans. We invite their parents and family and their principals. The principals read letter from their teachers offering great insight into these amazing kids. At the end of the year, these kids get to pick the Teacher of the Year. These meetings are our biggest turnouts with our members and guests.

We provide HRYF scholarships for King Kekaulike and are working on providing and additional scholarship for potential students who didn't make it the finals of HRYF but showed enough talent and skills to still deserve a scholarship.

Due to the Pandemic, our supported schools moved to fully virtual learning. Faculty and students had to adapt to proceed with their courses. Under current CDC, state and county guidelines we temporarily cannot assist in the classroom. However, we have kept in regular contact with all the advisors, counselors and teachers and will continue to do so till the end of the year.

We sponsor the Kapolei High School Interact Club. We are in close contact with the President and Advisor. We speak monthly and give updates on information we/they may benefit from, especially regarding scholarships and leadership opportunities.

We normally have three mentorship projects with Kapolei High School and Youth Challenge but with Covid we can no longer meet in person. We have kept the communications open to resume later in the year.

Our club has a member on the Hawaii Rotary Youth Foundation (HRYF) Board, and we support a youth to receive the 5K scholarship. The HRYF winner then attends a Club meeting and updates the Club on their college plans. This update is scheduled in May 2021.

Rotary Leadership Youth Awards (RYLA) takes place in late in February, and our Club will sponsor Interact students to attend the state-wide event virtually for the first time. RCK Club members have volunteered to serve on a committee that will distribute 'survivor kits' to each participant before they start on Friday 2/26 and deliver a pizza for their dinner on Saturday. The 'survivor kits' contain the essential items participants need for success in RYLA.

Our annual scholarship reception breakfast was not held in-person last in 2020 due to Covid restrictions. Business sponsorship for our 5K Virtual Run past September was Lifeline Fire and Securities.

We keep in contact with both our Exchange students from Chile and Argentina. We just did a virtual meeting with both and their families over Zoom. The bond created with their host family is so inspirational. They both have grown into beautiful young women who are working in leadership positions and starting families of their own soon.
