We have a member that has joined the newly formed D5000 Polio Plus Society and are encouraging other members to follow.

We are very, very fortunate to have a Foundation Chairman who also goes the extra mile to inform members where they are at TRF giving. At the end of each quarter, a report from the chairman is sent to each member to review their donation. The report shows how much the respective member has donated to TRF, PolioPlus and HRYF. If a member is close to their next PHF level, this information will encourage the member to move to the next level. At the start of the next Rotary year, we begin all over again. Too many Rotarians don't know how much they have contributed to TRF and it's really important to know that information. It reminds the members that the club has a TRF goal and each member has an obligation to support the club to reach its goal. Throughout the year, club members are also informed if we've reached our goal, if we're close to our goal and what we must do to achieve our goal. This is one reason why our club has been so successful in reaching our goals.....TRF numbers are shared with our members. Individual donations are strictly confidential and is only known to the chair. Total club donation amounts are shared with the members.
