It was a great event that we will continue to support every year. Because of her, we were also able to go and provide dinner for Hope Lodge's patients. They are Cancer patients usually from the outer islands that need a place to stay while getting treatment in Honolulu. Because they are usually so tired from the trip and treatments, we were able to bring them dinner and get to know them a bit. It was our first time there this year, but again, a great project we will continue to support.

For Christmas, we planned a Joint Christmas Party with East Honolulu, Diamond Head, E Club and Hawaii Kai up at Waialae Nui Rec Center. Laura Steelquist and her husband of course provided many many decorations! A bunch of us were there early to help set up. Once 530pm hit, people came dressed to impress with potluck foods in their hands! We had a wonderful time, lots of food, games, and most of all, great company.

Every March or April, our club is able to participate in Niu Valley Middle's Career Day where they host over 300 speakers. Each student is able to sign up for a different speaker each session, so they definitely get to hear a variety of speakers. The importance of education can not be overstated. Knowledge is critical in this day and age. Our involvement in the advancement of education was an international book donation to American Samoa. We collected and delivered containers of books to the school system of American Samoa.

We have spent multiple days joining with our Interact group and spending time on the USS Missouri cleaning it and preparing it for upcoming renovations. During this time onboard, we use the time to talk with the high school students and give them some guidance and direction in goal-setting and career choices and opportunities.

We pride ourselves in taking an interest in one another and what we do outside of Rotary. Three different members have given "guest" lectures on their careers and jobs. The diversity displayed shows how well-rounded a club we are. We have had a General Practice doctor talk about her career climb and how fulfilled she feels.
