**Youth Service Narrative for the Rotary Club of: Ala Moana**

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**Sponsored Earlyact Club:** The Club sponsors the Earlyact club at King William C. Lunalilo Elementary School (Lunalilo Elementary) which is also the Club's adopted school.

**Sponsored Interact Clubs:** The Club sponsors two Interact clubs, Hawaii Baptist Academy (H.B.A.) and McKinley High School (MHS) during the 2017-18 term. This year, the Club focused on collaboration with the Interact clubs on community service activities.

**Chartered Interact Club in the Rotary Year:** The Club assisted the McKinley High School (MHS) Tiger Interact Club charter in August 2017. The Interact student president was inspired to form the club at his school after having an opportunity to visit during a Rotary International Conference in which his father (a D5000 Rotarian) attended.

**Students in RYLA Program:** The Club budgeted for eight students to participate in the 2017 RYLA Camp held on November 24 to 26, 2017. Students from Hawaii Baptist Academy and McKinley High School were the beneficiaries of this sponsorship. One of the student at McKinley High School captured the students' experience at RYLA in a video he produced. The Club shared the experience during a weekly club meeting.

**Scholarship Participation:** The Club participated in a scholarship program by nominating a student from Hawaii Baptist Academy on February 17, 2018. A selection committee consisting of six of the Club Members evaluated and selected the candidate to receive a \$5,000 scholarship.

**Participation with Interact Club on Service or Fellowship Activities:** The Club's 2017-18 strategic plan included a collaboration theme with the sponsored Interact clubs as a way to get to know the students better. Thus far, the Club participated with the sponsored Interact clubs in eight community service and fellowship activities with 50% of the Club Members participating in one or more the activities:

- September 2, 2017: Collaborated with H.B.A. Interact club who assisted the Hawaii United Okinawa Association at its 2017 Hawaii Okinawa Festival.
- October 21, 2017: Hosted a pizza lunch for the Tiger Interact club's first community service project, a beach cleanup at Ala Moana Beach Park.
- November 11, 2017: Assisted H.B.A. Interact along with the school's Environmental Club in adopting a plot at Hamakua Marsh planting native trees and plants as part of a restoration project
- December 9, 2017 – Invited H.B.A. Interact to assist the Club in its annual Santa Clothes project; students assisted Lunalilo Elementary students shop for school supplies and clothing.
- December 10, 2017 – Participated in a joint Interact club project with H.B.A. and MHS during the 2017 Honolulu Marathon manning one of 11 water stations along the marathon route.
- December 23, 2017 – Invited H.B.A. Interact to join the Club at the annual participation in the Salvation Army Red Kettle program ringing bells.
- January 27, 2018 – Joined H.B.A. at Hamakua Marsh to tend to their plot that they adopted in 2017
- February 10, 2018 – Invited MHS Interact club to participate with the Club in the Lunalilo Elementary School Family Fun Fair
- April 7, 2018 – The Club looks forward to continuing its participation in the Hawaii Baptist Academy Fun Fair working the waffle dog appliances for the HBA Interact students.

**Awarded Scholarship:** The Club awarded a \$2,000 scholarship in the 2017-18 term to the Lunalilo Scholars Program which helps high school students afford community college.

## **Youth Service Narrative for the Rotary Club of Hanalei Bay**

Youth and education play a key role in our community. Our main goal this year was to start an **Interact Club** on the Northshore of Kauai. In **November of 2017 The Interact Club of Puukumu School was started**. With 16 members they are off with a bang. This year also we donated to the Puukumu School a check for \$1500 to help start a **Robotics Club**. They are now running full force and learning as they go.

We helped send students to **RYLA** at Kokee and 7 of our members went to the conference there and helped out with discussions on occupations and what direction the students were interested in once graduating from High School.

**Dictionaries** were passed out at three elementary schools, Hanalei Elementary, Kilauea Elementary, and Kanuikapono School. These children always look forward to these books since they are just more than definitions of words, but maps, sign language etc.

A **scholarship** was given to The **Kauai Community College** for students who believe they don't have the resources or abilities to enter college. This project is called the Wai'aleale Project and the check was presented at the Ho'omalua reception.

A donation was made to **Aloha Angel Foundation** which money is given to each teacher so they could take their students on a field trip and to purchase supplies they need for their classrooms. After School programs were also available to students. **We received two Significant Achievement Awards for this program.**

In December each year we take on a project called **Adopt an Angel**. We get the names of all foster children that are not in their family homes and purchase Christmas items of their choice so they will not be left out when Santa arrives. We made 97 angels happy this year. Each child who wants a bike, receives a bike by a silent donor in our community. Thank You Xmas letters are received by Santa every year.

A committee of our members are now working on the **HYRF Scholarship** of \$5,000 that is given out to a lucky student who has taken the initiative to apply for this scholarship.

Once again we are donating books called "**ALOHA**" to our elementary schools. The definition of Aloha is spread to all the community when learned at a young age. This book was written and promoted by Lahela Chandler Correa who was raised and still resides on the Kauai Northshore.

A donation was made to Grow Your Own Teachers (**GOOT**) a **program we started 8 years ago** where we help fund teachers who are doing their education and require needed financial help. They then must come back and teach on the island of Kauai for a designated period.

The education of our youth in our Community is very important in our Rotary lives for they are our future Rotarians.

## **YOUTH SERVICES 2017-2018 - Collaboration a Key to Youth Service Success**

The highlight of our Youth Services program and those of other Hawaii Island clubs must be collaborative spirit we share. We work so well together on many Youth Service programs and in many different ways.

**RYLA** has been a co-sponsorship of all Hawaii Island clubs with Host Club responsibilities rotating from one club to another. Since 2010, a multi-club team has presented relevant and well received training. In 2017 a multi-club effort is focusing on Logistical planning. Three East Hawaii clubs (Hilo, South Hilo and Hilo Bay) will host RYLA between 2017- 2020, we will continue to work together to refine logistical planning and camp management in the future.

**RYLA - Oahu** Invited to participate in RYLA - Oahu, three of our members stepped in to present training for a group of 84 students. This was a learning opportunity and fruitful engagement with 35 Liliuokalani Trust students and their advisors. This positive community partnership on Oahu helped boost student participation and fund the event is a positive concept we have initiated in recruiting students this year.

**Interact Clubs** In addition to our shared interest in RYLA, we also discuss the status of our Interact clubs and have begun a joint effort between the Rotary Clubs of Hilo and Hilo Bay to strengthen Interact club management and project planning through training planned for all Interact clubs' 2018-19 club leadership. Our club sponsors three Interact clubs; they vary greatly in size and community involvement. The **Waiakea High Interact Club** is outstanding in welcoming, engaging and nurturing several students with special need as members Their calendar is filled with many community and school projects. They draws high interest in membership each year resulting in membership over one hundred; this challenges club leadership with member activation and retention. The **Laupahoehoe Interact Club** is still young and building their membership. The **Interact Club of Waiakea Middle School** will be our first middle school club; it is ready to start with an enthusiastic and experienced advisor and a well bonded group of students.

**The Rotaract Club of East Hawaii** has five Rotary sponsors that share in in continued support. We have successfully recruited two past presidents of this Rotaract club into our club.

**Rotary Youth Exchange (RYE)** Here is another shared effort to support this international inbound and outbound student exchange. Five East Hawaii clubs share in costs. This school year, Hilo student, Lucas Chun, is in Japan and Sarah-Lou Philippe is in Hilo from France.

**Rotary in Kindergarten (RIK)** is a monthly reading program that involves Rotarians readers in Kindergarten classrooms in 11 schools. Students also receive take-home books for their own in addition to books added to their classroom library. Our project is a successful model that Rotary Club of Volcano has members have joined us to read in Naalehu elementary.

**NexTech STEM Programs** Our club partners with this non-profit to co-sponsor two series of STEM learning for grades 4-8 and grades 9-11 in East Hawaii. This involvement engages our STEM Professional in our club to boost career awareness and pathway guidance of students with high STEM achievement and interest. The next phase is real-world problem solving for our high school students along with business and community partners.

**Body Safety** is a new program of the YWCA that our club has volunteered to help. Twelve club members are now certified and ready to present body protection curriculum to school students between kindergarten and high school seniors.

**YOUTH SERVICE 2017-2018 involved 45% of our club membership to contribute 1,088 hours of service with a positive impact on 719 youth lives.**

## **Youth Service Narrative for Rotary Club of Honolulu Sunrise:**

**Reading to Students at Royal School and Lincoln Elementary** - Once a month, Sunrisers read to 7 classes at Royal Elementary and 4 groups at Lincoln Elementary. The books are signed by guest speakers for the club and are donated to the classes. Readers bring snacks to share with the students. Club members volunteered at nearly 60 reading sessions with the students throughout this school year. 11 Sunrisers participated in Read Across America Day/Dr. Seuss Day on March 2, 2018 at Royal School and Lincoln Elementary.

**Annual Dictionary Donation to Royal Elementary School** - Sunrisers donated 180 dictionaries to the third grade classes at Royal Elementary School. The kids are very appreciative of getting to own their own dictionaries.

**Donation of school supplies to Royal Elementary** - Honolulu Sunrise provided over \$2,000 of school supplies to Royal Elementary School. Supplies included whiteboards, paint, construction paper, dry erase markers, book covers, glue sticks, crayons, folders, ziploc bags, paper towels, and other items teachers need.

**Christmas Door Decorating Judges at Royal Elementary** - The doors were decorated by the children at the school in the spirit of Christmas.

**Pop Up Library** - Design, construction and maintenance of the Pop Up Libraries at Nuuanu YMCA and Kokua Kalihi Valley. Books were restocked at our PUL purchasing that could be taken, read, and enjoyed. Community members also donated their own books to the library.

**Hawaii's Children & Youth Day** - 5 Rotarians and 10 Interact Club Volunteers from Roosevelt High School manned the information booth at Hawaii Children and Youth Day. Sunrisers and Interactors assisted event-goers with information on various booths, performances, and information sessions happening at the event.

**Toy Drive & Christmas Caroling for Family Programs Hawaii.** Sunrisers donated over \$400 to Family Programs Hawaii to purchase toys for the annual holiday party. Roosevelt Interact Club members wrapped toys for foster children and their families who were attending. Sunrisers, Roosevelt Interact Club and McKinley Interact Club members sang carols and performed for families waiting in line to enter the Blaisdell Center for the event.

**Salvation Army's Angel Tree** – Mid Pacific Institute's Interact Club held a bake sale to raise funds and donate presents to the Angel Tree Program during the Holiday season.

**Kahauiki Village** - RCHS members and Interact Club Members from McKinley High School participating in a painting project at Kahauiki Village, housing for homeless families.

**Rotary Gives Thanks Day** – Sunrise members and Roosevelt Interact Club members cleared invasive species and planted trees at the Heeia Estuary in Kaneohe. Volunteers toured the Heeia Fish Pond to learn about its mission to provide sustainable fishing sources to native Hawaiians.

**Maunalua Bay Cleanup** - 10 volunteers from Mid Pacific Interact Club assisted Malama Maunalua to help remove invasive algae from Maunalua Bay. The Bay is infested with algae which affects other native and aquatic life.

**Hawaii Youth Rotary Foundation** – Sunrisers conducted scholarship interviews for a \$5000 scholarship and participated in the \$10,000 selection committee. We donated \$40 per capita to HRYF for a total donation of \$2000.

**Sponsored RYLA Participant** - Roosevelt Interact sent one future officer of their club to RYLA to provide additional leadership training to the club's younger generation.

**Supported Mardi Gras Mambo** - Volunteers from Roosevelt and Mid-Pac Interact Clubs volunteered at the RCHS Club Fundraiser. The students assisted with ticket sales, silent auction, decor and cleanup.

**Relay for Life** – Sunrisers chaperoned 40 Roosevelt Interact members & provided tents, food, chairs & tables to help raise funds and awareness for cancer.

## Youth Service Narrative for Rotary Club of: HONOLULU SUNSET

**This year we combined continuing support to ongoing programs with several new and innovative projects.**

**Hawaii Keiki (NEW)** The University of Hawaii School of Nursing began a program in public elementary schools to provide Registered Nurses for the “**school nurse**” program formerly staffed by unskilled aides. The Dean of the school approached our club to request support for non-medical supplies to assist in their program. We provided \$2,822 in D5000 Matching Grant money to purchase toys which could be used to assist in determining the reason for assistance and to help relax the child in a stressful situation.

**Jefferson Elementary S.T.E.M** Items provided were “**Person of Character**” Banners to encourage good study habits and citizenship, a quadcopter **for aerial photography projects, underwater drone kit** to observe what happens underwater in their Aquaponics project, food for their Aquaponics and steel book supports for the library. Cost \$1,060 D5000 Matching Grant

**Hoku Lani Elementary Library (NEW)** Provided \$2,000 D5000 Matching Grant to **repair damage to their library** and purchase a **Shure Microphone** for use at school assemblies.

**Dictionaries for Third Graders** Provided dictionaries to three elementary schools in the Waikiki area. Our schools were Jefferson, Hokulani and Noelani. 15 Rotarians participated. This is a highlight of our Youth projects as we interact with 3<sup>rd</sup> graders, not only providing dictionaries but showing them how to use them and providing a copy of the **4 way test** and explaining it to the students.

**Holiday Shopping** 12 Rotarians escorted 3 families Holiday shopping at Sam’s Club. These families have seriously ill children undergoing medical treatment in Honolulu and are temporarily living at the H.U.G.G.S. House. This event allowed the children of the families to shop for gifts the family could not provide due to the burden of medical costs. After shopping, a pizza meal was shared by all. This was our **Rotary Gives Thanks Project**.

**Hale Kipa (NEW)** Youth outreach support for homeless youth in Waikiki. This is a **new program** for us. It is designed to provide support to the many homeless youth living in Waikiki. We provided 15 backpacks along with T-shirts and boxer shorts requested by the center

**Waipahu JROTC support** This year we concentrated on their leadership development. D5000 Grant money provided **Walkie Talkie** for use at formations and during emergency exercises; **Two pop-up** tents to provide shade during field activities; **two compasses** for field training; uniform equipment; and funds for **20 cadets** to attend a **three day leadership camp**.

RYLA (January 15-18th). Our Club joined the other Maui RCs in providing stipends to send students to the camp. Our members joined other Rotary Leaders in a "speed dating" event just before the graduation ceremony. Members were actively involved in planning and promoting this event and our club contributed \$1,800 to the event budget and student stipends. --One Day Interact Conference in October. The Rotary Club of Kona does three major youth service projects.

First, through our 501(c)(3) ("the Rotary Club of Kona Foundation"), we organized the volunteers at the Mitsubishi Electric PGA Championship at the Four Seasons Hualalai. We have been doing this for approximately 20 years. We receive a check in return for our support of this wonderful tournament. Each year (including last year) we gave scholarships totaling \$22,000 to college bound students in West Hawaii. Some of the students used the scholarship to go to our local community college, and other students used the scholarship to assist with the costs of mainland colleges.

Second, the Rotary Club of Kona does "keiki vision", which is vision screening of third grade students. In a partnership with All Eyes (i.e. Dr. Timothy Kale), we complete a vision screening for third grades at West Hawaii schools. Last year, we did "keiki vision" at the following West Hawaii schools: Kahakai Elementary School (Public), Kealakehe Elementary School (Public), Innovations (Charter School), Makua Lani Christian Academy (Private School), and Holualoa Elementary (Public). In total, it is more than 400 third grades. As part of "keiki vision", we gave every student a Dictionary afterwards!

Third, our club sponsors the Interact club at Kealakehe High School. We give them \$2,000 to help cover costs. We send a number of these students to RYLA. Our club members help drive the schools to the RYLA camp at the Volcano. It's a 2 hour drive one-way.

**Kahauiki Village Project -**

Coordinated a youth services project in January 2018, volunteering to service and clean units at the Kahauiki Village at Sand Island. This is a high-profile project that gained lots of media attention and created housing for the homeless in the area. The project provides them with studio or 1-bedroom units and is the result of the vision of business man Duane Kurisu. Our Metro members joined 19 students from Punahou School to do a general cleaning of the brand new units and assisted with maintenance of the common areas around the facilities.

**Dr. Seuss' Birthday Project -**

In March 2018, Metro Rotarians read Dr. Seuss Books to 2 of the 3rd grade classes at Princess Kailulani Elementary, as part of celebrating Dr. Seuss's Birthday, and to promote literacy and encourage reading amongst the youth population. The project is part of an annual initiative that we will continue to participate in, and possibly add more schools in the inner city areas where assistance is much needed.

**Kalihi Elementary School -**

In conjunction with Community Service Committee, we stenciled, school pride slogans on the stairwells at Kalihi Elementary School. The goal of the project was to instill school pride, to create a nice, positive school environment, and encourage self empowerment amongst the students. It is wonderful to support a school that has a very large population of underprivileged students.

**Diamonds in the Rough Scholarship Program -**

Each year, Metro Rotary supports one or two students from local high schools who have been mediocre students but have shown an interest in turning their academic careers around. The typical scholarship is \$5000 per student, and most students attend community college-- however a number of them have gone on to University of Hawaii at Manoa. One of our past recipients was Kini Zamora, now a professional designer, famous for his appearance on the hit TV show, Project Runway. Another past recipient of the scholarship actually went on to give back-- and created a mobile app to assist high school students in finding scholarship funds and showing them how to apply for it.

**Children and Youth Day at the State Capital -**

In 1994, the Hawai'i State Legislature and Governor established Children and Youth Day in Hawai'i as the first Sunday of every October, to celebrate and honor our children and youth and the special contributions they make to our community. An annual resource celebration for youth and families held on the grounds of the capital and city and county buildings, our metro rotarians had a booth at the festival in 2017, providing information and directing attendees to services provided at the festival.

**Keiki Backpack Project-**

Metro Rotary has long supported this program with volunteers and funding. Twice per year (9/2017 and 3/2018), Metro Rotarians participate at the Hawaii Foodbank facility to pack a month's worth of weekend food packets. At the last Keiki Backpack day, Metro packed bags of food for a week-long school vacation – the first time such a thing has been possible. Metro packed 800 bags of food for Princess Ka'iulani Elementary School low-income students and 450 bags of food for Linapuni Elementary School- a total of 1,250 packages of food.

. After a year-long hiatus, we were able to meet with a science teacher named Cuyote Hawkins at Farrington High School who has agreed to restart the Interact Club on campus. This was done in early 2018 and several members of our club were present for the introduction and meeting with Mr. Hawkins. During the meeting, not only did we discuss the expectations and provide a background of Rotary, but we also discussed doing a career day and partnering together for community service projects. The career day is being planned for April and we're very excited for this event. A long-time member who recently passed away was a Farrington High School graduate and was very passionate about giving back to this high school, which has a lot of underprivileged students and is also within our club's district.

. Cultural Exchange - We do a cultural exchange with our sister club, Kyoto West. This year, two children from our club flew to Kyoto and were hosted by our sister club for approximately two weeks. Next year, we will be accepting two children from Kyoto West and the exchange alternates every year. The host company provides the costs for all food, entertainment, transportation and lodging. We have done this exchange for many, many years. The children from our club that have participated in this exchange have had incredible experiences and are so grateful for the opportunity. This also strengthens the relationships between our club's members.

. Scholarships - We are awarding \$20,000 in scholarships to Hawaii students pursuing a post-secondary education. This is in addition to our club's sponsored student for the Hawaii Rotary Youth Foundation (HRYF), who will also receive \$5,000. Our club has been generously providing these scholarships for years and select the recipients based on merit and financial need.
