Youth Service Narrative for Rotary Club of:

RCEH sponsors an Interact Club at Kalani High School and the Rotaract Club at Chaminade University

This past year we sponsored 3 students to attend RYLA.

As a club we sponsored the HRYF Scholarship by donating to HRYF and sponsoring a scholarship application. The student selected by our committee exuded great poise and confidence. However, during the interview, she confided to the committee that without assistance, she would not be able to attend any college. Her scores were outstanding, but the family and financial situation was dire. Some fact-checking on our part confirmed the statement and with the scholarship offer from RCEH, she now can move forward to becoming an educated and purpose driven member of the community.

From the scholarship interviews, the committee determined a need to provide mentorship and skills sharpening of students to handle interviews. A special committee was formed using the talents in the Club of business leaders to mentor and offer training to the Rotaract Club at Chaminade to prepare for job interviews after college. The guides are being written now with input from Rotaract. Unfortunately, the first rounds will take place after submission of this award nomination and we are unable to provide the impact statement.

Both Interact and Rotaract Clubs assisted in the Aina Haina Library Book Sale in August of 2018. They provided physical labor to move over 2,000 books and other media to the front of the library in preparation for the sale. The Rotary Club handled the 2-day sale. Members of the Rotaract Club came back in the last hour of the sale to assist in clean up and movement of unsold books. Without their youthful exuberance and healthy backs, the cleanup would have taken several hours. It took 8 of their members less than an hour to move the books and media back to the appropriate areas. Last year with 10 regular club members it took us 2 hours. Glad to have young people around.

Early Act Club -

One of our main goals this year was to increase the membership in our Early Act Club at Niu Valley Middle School. We have over 20 students enrolled in the club. We had a table at the school the day of registration where we had interested students sign up that day. The parents were bringing their children so it was very effective in having the parents urge the students to join the club. This is our second year of having an Early Act Club at Niu Valley Middle School. The club held elections the beginning of the school year. At that time, they determined their projects for the year – Campus Beautification (April, 2018) Recycling on campus (continual) and participate with our club for the Plant a Tree day Project. There were 9 students and two leaders who joined our club at this event. They also participated in our potluck after the event. We have the officers hold the meetings twice a month, with an agenda, pledge of allegiance, committees, etc. They are very excited about their projects.

Youth Scholarship Program –

Every year Rotary Club Kahala Sunrise sponsors 3 students to win an HYRF scholarship. First prize winner receives \$5,000 and second and third winner gets \$1500. This year 4 club members interviewed a total of 10 students and our \$5,000 winner was chosen to compete with the rest of the district for the \$10,000 win. Aside from the scholarships, we also sponsored 2 students this year from Kalani High School to attend RYLA which gives them the opportunity to learn leaderships skills for the weekend. We are able to fund these through our fundraiser dinners and donations. 26% participation

Youth Mentoring – Career Day

10 Rotarians from our club participated in the Niu Valley Middle School Career Day. They spent the morning doing an active presentation for the students describing what their particular vocation was, getting them interested and excited about what they could accomplish in their life.

RCKS sponsors an Interact Club at Island Pacific Academy. There are about 35 members of the club. An RCKS member serves as a liaison from RCKS to maintain frequent contact with the Interact officers, attend meetings of the club on campus, and coordinate with RCKS when Interact needs support, financially or with adult assistance. Student leadership this year has been strong, organizing many service opportunities for their members.

Activities of the Interact Club this year have included:

- Monthly cleaning of whiteboards in all campus classrooms

- Helping staff track meets organized by the school

- Fundraising on campus to support assistance for disaster relief

- Cancer Walk

- Food baskets at Thanksgiving for local police, fire personnel and library staff Christmas caroling at local senior care center

- Assisted student council with food drive for Food Bank

- Valentine 's Day activities at retirement residence

- " Senior " Prom at this same retirement residence planned for this spring (a repeat of a very successful event last spring)

Interact joint service with RCKS members:

October 2017 - Spookapalooza fundraiser support for the Hawaii Historic Railroad Society – RCKS members and Interact students dressed in scary costumes/makeup to participate in this annual event and support the work of the railroad society.

April 2017 and 2018 – RCKS members and Interact students combine forces to volunteer on the USS Missouri for the morning on Rotary at Work Day. The volunteer coordinator of the ship assigns tasks each year, which range from scrubbing the deck, to painting interior spaces. Almost all of our RCKS club participates in this event each year, and half or more of the students group.

Hawaii Rotary Youth Foundation Scholarship Program

RCKS participates in this program each year, making a donation of \$40 per member to the fund and soliciting and picking up applications from local high schools. A committee of 4 people arrange interviews of the applicants, and one of our club members participates on the area interview board. We have forwarded an applicant in each of the last four years.

Fourth of July is celebrated with music in the park and fireworks. Our club and Interact members sell hot dogs, feed the marching band and sell flags every year. The Interact club assists with our biggest fundraiser. We did a school supply drive with the Interact club, delivered dictionaries to third graders. Our club also supported IMUA kids with a dollar donation.

The local Tutor Program has been one of our club's mainstays for supporting local children. We donate dollars and also donate a weekly book which we have our speakers sign.

Our club did a clean up and renovation of tennis courts for use by local students

Scholarships are one through the D5000 program for which our club selects one high school student.

We offer three Vocational Scholarships also which are funded through one of our fundraisers. These are available to anyone interested in attending a one to two year training program rather than a traditional four year academic degree. Our first year we awarded one to a girl who wanted to study airplane mechanics. Since then we have had auto mechanics and farmers as recipients.

Every Halloween we sponsor a Keiki parade with our other area clubs and have kids, animals, firemen, the mayor and other celebrities participate. At the end there are treats for the kids.

RYLA has always been very important to our club. We have fully supported it with monetary contributions and whenever possible manpower.

Read Aloud America is also a project our club supports with yearly donations to buy books.

Rotary Club of Lahaina Youth Service

Since 1983, RC Lahaina has annually awarded scholarships; from as between \$50,000 to \$15,000. This year, RC Lahaina will be awarding \$15,000 of scholarships for deserving seniors of Lahainaluna High School, Molokai High School and Maui Preparatory Academy.

Along with our Club scholarship, we sponsored Nikki Zamani of LHS for the Hawaii Rotary Youth Foundation. Nikki will be receiving \$5,000 from HRYF.

Not only have the Rotary Club of Lahaina provided scholarships for over three decades, but since the inception of the Lahaina After School Tutor (LAST) program in Lahaina, 17 years ago, the Rotary Club of Lahaina has provided financial assistance to help LAST with its expenses. LAST helps over 200 4th to 8th grade students in Lahaina. Because of the high number of students, several of the Members of RC Lahaina and their spouses help tutor these children.

Last November, I met with one of the Counselors of LHS to revive the Career Shadowing program that our Club enjoyed doing for the students of LHS. At our meeting, I was introduced to Mr. Erin Thomas, who is teaches Graphic Design, Photography and Videography. At this meeting, I was also introduced to the Advisor of the school's Aloha Club, Ms. Tara Nakata.


I shared with Ms. Nakata of my trip to the Philippines and I asked if she can ask her Aloha Club to help me by collecting used clothes, toys, school supplies, and shoes for the street children of Manila. Without hesitation, she agreed and to help with the project.

I also reached out to Mr. Keenan Reader, Advisor for the Interact Club of Maui Preparatory Academy to see if his Interactors will be able to help me with the same project as LHS's Aloha Club. He supported the project and both Mr. Reader and I made a presentation to MPA's Interactors. From this project, we collected over 1,000 pounds of clothes, toys, books, school supplies, footwear and other miscellaneous items that we delivered to the street children of Manila and the children of the Bajao Tribe and Obu Manuvu Tribe. Unfortunately, since we are only allowed 2 fifty pounds each of luggage, we could only bring with us 250#. The rest will have to be taken to the Philippines on our next International mission.

While in the Philippines to distribute the collected items, I discovered that Rotary Club of Davao does not have an Interact Club. I encouraged Pres Fil Divino of RC Davao to establish an Interact Club at Francisco Bustamante National High School. They were concern that their Club does not have the fund to start the process and for the Interact Club to have it seed money. We decided to donate \$300 to start the Interact Club. Hopefully, soon F. Bustamante National High School and Maui Preparatory Academy will form Sister Interact Club relationship

The RC of Lahaina have included the MPA Interact Club in its School Supply Drive, Food Drive, Halloween Parade and Beach Clean Up.

With Mr. Erin Thomas, we set up an ongoing internship with his students and have used his students to design logos for other organizations and company in exchange for a donation to help the program to pay for its supplies and equipment.

This year in addition to planning duties, our club members participated again in breakout vocational group discussions at RYLA. 9 volunteers from our club participated and contributed 37 hours total. They enjoyed engaging in discussions with the youth present to give an understanding of their careers, what it takes to get there, how challenging the path was to get there, how to overcome adversity, how to align a path to success.

Our club contributed \$1,000 to HRYF and announced the \$5,000 scholarship opportunity. 3 club members participated in the panel of judges and interview 10 highly qualified candidates for the scholarship. While it was a very difficult decision, one student was nominated for the scholarship award. A new scholarship was also created for high achieving students in Kauai Community College's skilled trade programs in an effort to impact the growing skills gap in our community. A total of \$5,000 was awarded to 7 deserving students in the following trades: Electronics Technology, Electrical Installation and Maintenance, Carpentry, Facilities Engineering, Automotive Technology. Very few trade scholarships exist on Kauai and RCPB was proud to create this much needed alternative for our community.

On 1/20/18 our club worked with Island School Interact Club members on our annual adopt-a-highway cleanup with the help and sponsorship of Matson. It was a great morning to enjoy each other's company and get to know the youth members in our sponsored Interact Club while helping to clean up our environment.

For a literacy project, our club again purchased dictionaries and distributed them to all third grade classes at Koloa Elementary School, Kalaheo Elementary School, and Island School. What makes this such a wonderful project is that even in this digital age, the students were in such awe that people would give them their very own dictionary to keep in class and eventually take home. The children participated in word find activities utilizing guide words, and also learned that they could use the dictionary to locate information on many different things like the periodic table of elements, multiplication tables, Presidents of the United States, facts about the 50 states.

We also had the opportunity to provide \$6,875 in funding to Boys and Girls Club, west side clubhouse, which they used to help offset their costs to remain in their current facility where their kids meet each day. A club donor also matched an additional \$5,625 to support the effort.
