What was the most impactful international project completed? (Describe in 200 words or less)

The RCSH is still involved with our International Project of 2022-23, Water Hauling Truck for the Marshallese community in Hawaiian Oceanview Estates. During COVID, there was an emphasis on handwashing and basic sanitation and the Marshallese leaders expressed their concern because of lack of access to clean water. The Oceanview community does not have water infrastructure and depends on individual water catchment systems to supply water to their homes. Most of the Marshallese homes do have catchment systems and depend on a County spigot that provides clean water to the area. Though the access to that water is open and free, the Marshallese do not have a way to gather and transport the water to their homes. The Marshallese community leaders expressed a need to have a reliable 4-wheel drive vehicle (because of the terrain in Oceanview), containers to transport water and water pumping equipment. The Rotary Club of South Hilo took on the project and coordinated the fundraising throughout District 5000.
