What was the most impactful international project completed? (Describe in 200 words or less)

In August, I joined Dr. James Ham's team to help implement his GG 2456569 for a WASH in Papua New Guinea (PNG); helped plant a Peace Pole which is the only one in PNG; helped give a collective birthday party for orphans who never had a birthday party because none knew when they were born. I presented a letter of appreciation to RC Port Moresby in PNG because this Club has donated \$ 10,000 to the Maui Fires Relief fund. We stopped over in Sydney where I presented a letter of appreciation to RC Eastwood-Gladesville because this Club donated 5,000 Australian dollars to the WASH project. My cousin is in this Club, and he joined Dr. James' team.

In October, I went to Thailand to present a plaque of appreciation to RC Doiprabaht because this Club donated \$ 500 to the Maui Fires Relief fund. This Thai Club remembered when our Club had implemented a GG for COPD equipment for the hospital in their hometown of Lampang. Dave Mozdren has done many GGs for medical equipment in Thailand. What was the most impactful international project completed? (Describe in 200 words or less)

Rotary HPH successfully raised over \$400 in cash through Lei donations during our Annual Fundraiser Event. These funds were utilized to host a group birthday party for an orphanage in Mont Hagen, located in the “The Highlands” province of Papua New Guinea. We collaborated with Water Hands Hope, an organization founded by James Ham, MD, who was present to coordinate this event on our behalf. Due to his graduate school commitments, Brian was unable to participate again this year, and we extend our gratitude to Dr. Ham for serving as our on-the-ground representative for this event.

Additionally, we contributed our annual allocation to D5000’s GG-2458747. This contribution funded a medical device and supply grant benefiting Chiang Khong Hospital in northern Thailand. Examples of current and past devices provided include hemodialysis machines, sterilizer cabinets, hydrogen peroxide sprayers, defibrillators, and infant hearing screening devices. Our club member, Allen Kamemoto, who has a longstanding association with the Honolulu Sunrise Club, shared insights on the partnership between his former club and clubs in Thailand. Given that our club includes several medical professionals (Emilie, John, and Brian), participating in this Global Grant initiative has been both exciting and rewarding for us.

International Service projects with our Sister Clubs in the Philippines:

ROTARY CLUB of METRO ILOILO:

1. Installed photovoltaic to provide electricity, constructed a clean water system and delivered school supplies and hygiene kits for the 250+ students of Bayas Elementary School.
2. Provided tv projectors, electronic equipment, and hygiene kits for the 250+ students of Isabel Roces Memorial School.

ROTARY CLUB of PACO MANILA:

1. With the support of Rotary Club of Up-Country Maui, Rotary Club of Kahului, Rotary Club of Kent (WA) and Rotary Club of Point West (CA), we constructed MOBILE POTABLE WATER SYSTEM 2.0. System is to provide potable water in neighborhoods where people do not have access to clean water during/after a calamity.
2. Constructed sanitation and handwash station for the 300+ students of ESMERALDA INTERGRATED SCHOOL. Donated sports equipment to help with the school's athletic program.
