Club members participated in a D5000 Education, and Clean Water project in Nepal and reported on their project. A future service project emerged from that trip to support clean toilets.

The RCHS hosted five Ukrainian medical doctors as part of the Open World Program to engage our Honolulu medical professionals to exchange technical, planning and innovation information. The relationships built still exist with RCHS supporting rehabilitation hospitals in Ukraine. The purchase of medical supplies and rehabilitation equipment for hospitals in Lviv and Vinnytsia Ukraine provides ongoing treatment for both civilian and military persons affected by the war. Injuries supported include spinal cord, amputations, burns and other catastrophic injuries. This international service project benefited both our community and Ukraine's. The Open World portion of this ongoing, multi-faceted project, led by RCHS, involved more than 10 clubs, numerous Rotarians and more than 500 volunteer hours.

Mission to Vietnam, Honglinh Disable Children School by St. Paul's Sister on March 11,2023. Travel from Hanoi for 1 hr flight to Vinh City in Central Vietnam, +1.5 hr drive to the Center. School have 160 permanent disabled Children fr. 2-18 yr old, half are orphans & lived in the Center & 20 teachers & 8 Catholic nuns. We provided the school requested, one school yr supply of 14,000 lb rice, multi vitamins, medicines for diarrhea, fever, cough, cold, allergy, insect bites etc. antiseptic ornament pks, sanitation supplies, 2 types of disposal gloves, wipes, masks, hand sanitizer gel, few hand held thermometers. School stationary supplies: ball point pens, calculators, several food safety cooking thermometers. Vocational & education workshop, total of 5 topics: world map and geography, Dangerous Food safety Mistakes, 4 steps to Food Safety, manage Covid symptoms & oral dental Hygene.
