Our club sponsors both Roosevelt High School and Mid-Pacific Institute's Interact Clubs each year. Our club's partnership with these youth organizations has been very meaningful and rewarding and shows tangible impact.

This year, Roosevelt received a District 5000 grant in the amount of \$500 for a composting project on campus that helps to divert food waste from the cafeteria into composting machines that can be accessed by students, faculty, and organizations (gardening club) on campus. The students also plan on providing the compost to the community including the nearby Makiki Community Garden run by the City. Honolulu Sunrise has been helping the Roosevelt Interactors plan and execute the project and also donated matching funds to its success and completion.

This provided an avenue for students to develop leadership skills and have ownership in the project. The creation of a new garden area is also an exciting component of this project. A garden provides an opportunity for students to learn about plant life cycles and the importance of healthy eating habits. By providing the resources to establish a compost pile at Farrington High School, the RCWH is promoting environmental stewardship and sustainable practices in the community.
