What is the most impactful international project completed? Why should your club be recognized as a Club of Excellence in International Service? (Describe in 200 words or less)

For the second year in a row, Rotary HPH's member Brian (an ICU nurse at Kaiser Permanente), joined other Rotarians from around the globe for a Service Trip to Papua New Guinea (PNG). He utilized his professional skillsets during this service trip in multiple ways: Professional & cultural exchange with clinical staff at Kundiawa Hospital, Mount Hagen Hospital, and Saint Joseph's Hospital. Additionally, he aided in creating and teaching CPR, Advanced Cardiac Life Support, and first aid refresher in-service/sessions at those various sites. Brian held some informational/educational lectures at the Kundiawa Nursing School with the 3rd year nursing students. Used CPR mannequins, a set of baby/child/adult, were also donated to both the Nursing School and Kundiawa Hospital education department. Rotary HPH was able to provide \$500 worth of donations for medical supplies and Hawaii goodies to various departments within Kundiawa Hospital, and instructors and students at Kundiawa Nursing School. A cash donation to the ICU helped purchase linen and incontinence supplies for patients that cannot afford them. Our club supported the efforts of our member Brian as he dedicated his time and talents to this worthy service project which deserves recognition as Club of Excellence in International Service.

3. With Rotary Club of Metro Iloilo build a deep-well clean water system for Jamabalud Elementary School, a school of 50⁺ students in Iloilo.
4. With Rotary Club of Paco Manila, we build a deep-well clean water system for Esmeralda Elementary School, a school of 350+ students in Pangasinan, Philippines.
5. With our Sister Club, Rotary Club of Davao, helped build stairs for Dakudao National High School, a school of 4,000 students in Davao. Provided books, clothes, supplies for abandoned boys of Davao Boystown.
6. With our Sister Club, Rotary Club of Cebu East, distributed school supplies, hygiene kits and slippers to five elementary schools, approximately 1,500+ students throughout Oslob, Cebu.
