Yesterday, Ryan installed new gutters on a home in Kahana. Massage Therapist Tina saw three clients. Manuel's landscaping business serviced two yards and picked up another client in the neighborhood.

What do all these seemingly "everyday" tasks have in common? Simple: The tools these Lahaina small business owners used to complete these jobs were purchased by our Club's Vocational Sponsorship Program.

Our Club created a Vocational Sponsorship Program to identify business owners and help them replace not only their tools and equipment lost in the fire, but the livelihoods lost on 8/8/23. To date, Lahaina Sunrise has supported over 73 individual business owners with the direct purchase and delivery of nearly \$51,000 in replacement "tools of the trade".

We are currently in receipt of our 6th round of applications for our sponsorship program and plan to continue. In truth, the organization, logistics and funding for this program is no small task. But for us, getting these small businesses up and running again does not just get them back on their feet but creates hope for a brighter future.
