

Mililani Sunrise has 2 sister clubs, the Rotary Club of Manila Bay and the Rotary Club of Nara Oomiya.

In August 2010, RCMS concluded an \$18,000 Matching Grant, "Clean Water Please", to construct 27 water wells in Quezon Province, PI. Host partner was RCMB. The wells were built in 27 barangays, including 5 schools.

We were honored to celebrate RCNO 45th anniversary, in January 2024. Our president accompanied by her husband, went to Japan on behalf of the club, and the VIP treatment began immediately upon arrival. At their celebration luncheon, our president gave a speech and presented their club with a gift. AVIP tour of the city followed; it was a memorable trip that will not be forgotten.

Close in proximity to RCNO, is the Holy Family Home orphanage that we have supported for over 25 years. Approximately, 10 years ago, we visited the orphanage; played games and sang with the children. Every Christmas, members of our club donate money and gifts to HFH. The gifts are wrapped and delivered by soldiers from Schofield Barracks.

Our PE, Kara England, traveled to Nepal in 2022. She expected to participate in another Global Project there in 2023 but the project was cancelled so Hawaii could focus on Maui's needs. We are continuing this year to support the three schools in Damauli, Nepal (Uday, Mehendru, Jyoti) with smart TVs and physical education equipment. This will enhance the educational experience and overall well-being of the students. By providing access to modern technology, students can engage in interactive learning experiences, access educational resources and explore a world of knowldge beyond the confines of traditional textbooks and classrooms. Physical education equipment improves physical health and also enhances cognitive function, concentration and academic performance and creates opportunites to foster teamwork, discipline and leadership skills. It's an investment in the future of the country. We will continue to support these schools and hope to be able to visit them in the 24-25 Rotary year.
