What is the most impactful vocational project completed? Why should your club be recognized as a Club of Excellence in Vocational Service? (Describe in 200 words or less)

Our Club worked together with Waipahu Safe Haven providing \$500 grant funds to their vocational program with the help from District 5000. The Micronesian women of Waipahu Safe Haven were given the opportunity for training with funds the program don't necessarily have to enhance their crafting skills in hope to create a business. This project can help the women earn a living in the future and become financially independent in a way that is culturally sensitive.

Waipahu Safe Haven's mission include a focus on improving the success of the community and helping individuals and families out of poverty. The organizations "Hele to Work" program educate individuals about the employment process and teaching how to create a resume and cover letter, find jobs, and complete an application. In addition, learn the proper interview skills. Overall, as a conduit to the diverse immigrant and migrant populations in Waipahu, their organization is led by Chuukese and Marshallese steering committees, discussing different areas of need, how to navigate challenges, and build support for one another in their respective communities.
