RC Windward Oahu has its very own Windward Rotary Education Foundation (WREF) that annually provides a four-year grant (for 4 year college tuition) of \$ 20,000 (\$5,000 each year) to excellent and promising students on the Windward side. There is also an annual, one-time grant of \$ 1,000 for a student who attends a two year college like Windward Community College, or the committee decides the student represents the Ross Mickey Award criteria. To date, \$222,322 + has been awarded to 26 students.
