What was the most impactful project completed? (Describe in 1000 characters or less)

Our "Cupcakes for a Cause" was likely our most impactful project completed this year. It has become an annual event because it is so popular with our members and with our Interact Club. The event was held Saturday, October 22 close to World Polio Day in the parking lot of our local bakery "Cupcake & Things". The Interactors educated their peers about the need to end polio before the event and then they made large "End Polio Now" posters to wave during the event. We sold packs of cupcakes with one cupcake in each pack frosted with purple frosting to represent the purple dye used to mark children's pinkies indicating they've been vaccinated. A EPN flyer was attached to each pack. We had a drive-thru pick up for orders and also sold cupcakes on the spot. We waved signs, wore "End Polio Now" shirts and hats, and collected donations in addition to selling cupcakes. We raised \$537.37 which, when matched by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, made \$1612.11 for PolioPlus!

We had several very impactful projects. The Pahoa Pahoa Paint the Town project was part of the Recovery and Resilience Plan for Pahoa from the eruption and our club took the lead on working with a local artist and painted a huge over 100 foot long mural at the county pool. Over 6 Rotary Clubs joined in with us. The mural depicted the lines of a Hawaiian chant reflecting our place here and was beautiful and inspiring.

Our Genki Hou Clean the Waihonu pond initiative engaged over 10 groups and at least 6 Rotary Clubs over 6 events of ball making and tossing and will culminate in a District Conference presentation and final 'ball toss' in the pond. We will then complete our 3rd water quality testing with the University of Hawaii. The initial first 2 water quality tests show a great improvement in many parameters of water quality. These were two amazing and impactful projects that brought heightened awareness of Rotary and made a difference in our community.

Our Rotary Gives Thanks Project in November 2022, was providing Thanksgiving dinner for farmers in the Waipahu community of the Pacific Gateway Center. We purchased 90 bentos from A Catered Experience, so we supported a local business as well during these challenging times. Pacific Gateway Center is a nonprofit serving poverty-stricken families, as well as immigrants, refugees, asylum seekers, and survivors of sex and human trafficking. Pacific Gateway Center is also known for its training programs to help immigrants become productive members in its own communities and some eventually become proud small business owners in Hawaii.

We have committed to this project since 2019 and the staff said that Rotary was the first-ever organization that had provided such a beautiful meal for the families, plus goodie bags for the children.
