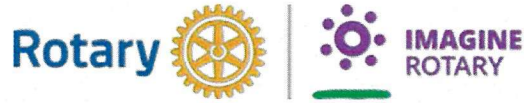

**What was the most impactful international project completed? (Describe in 1000 characters or less)**

Rotary HPH's member, Brian (an ICU nurse), took part of this past year's International Service to Papua New Guinea (PNG). He was able to utilize both his personal interests and professional skill sets on this project. Additionally, our Club provided \$500 worth of medical supplies and goodies from Hawaii to various departments within Kundiawa Hospital in the Highlands of PNG. Brian did a (medical) cultural exchange with the staff in the ER and ICU. They shared best practices knowledge and experiences and discussed the various barriers to healthcare in a 3rd world country being a rural part of the country. Additionally, Brian was able to help support the Rotary Global Grant of "POCUS" (Point of Care Ultrasound) with training and donations. Multiple D5000 clubs contributed to this Grant, and the group taught courses to the Physicians and other higher-level medical practitioners in PNG. Brian will continue to support the International Service project next year.

Global Grant GG2096260- installation of a solar powered seawater desalination system at Baliguian Island in the Philippines

Our club partnered with the Rotary Club of Iloilo to install a water desalination system. The population of about 1000 people on the island had lost use of an older mechanical system and were using their boats to travel 3 hours each way to the mainland to get bottled water. The local host club arranged for engineers to build and install a workable solar system. The island people are able to maintain it, and the host club is able to follow up, to be sure the system continues to benefit the residents on the island. Several of our members traveled to the island to confirm completion, bringing with them slippers and school supplies, and bringing home many pictures of happy people.
