What were the impactful Youth Service activities completed? (Describe in 200 words or less)

Honolulu Sunrise continues to invest in youth through leadership development, literacy, and school partnerships. We proudly sponsor the Roosevelt Interact Club by attending meetings, mentoring students, and supporting their service projects. In October 2025, on behalf of the District, our club led the annual Children and Youth Day booth, where Roosevelt Interactors took the lead in running games and activities for hundreds of children, gaining valuable leadership and volunteer experience. We also partnered with Read To Me International (RTMI), a nonprofit co-founded by our club, to enhance our Children's and Youth Day presence and expand our literacy outreach.

This year, we established a new partnership with Kaiulani Elementary, where we hosted two RTMI read-alouds, participated in Career Day, revitalized the student garden, and completed a major refresh of the school's Peacock Bus, a student rewards center. We also initiated plans with the school and University of Hawai'i architecture students to develop a campus master plan, creating a long-term vision to guide future community investment. Metro Rotary partnered with us on several of these projects, demonstrating the power of Rotary collaboration.
