Through support of Global Grant 2685623, Rotary HPH contributed to sustainable healthcare improvements in Papa New Guinea. While not onsite, the club remained actively engaged through financial support, planning collaboration and technical expertise, demonstrating that meaningful international service extends beyond physical presence. The project focused on two measurable outcomes, strengthening emergency, critical, and ophthalmic care through training and equipment and expanding community health education and screenings. Rotary HPH's involvement leveraged existing relationships and professional expertise, ensuring the project was strategically aligned and effectively executed.
