Enclosed are the Hawaii Rotary Youth Foundation (HRYF) scholarship applications for distribution to interested graduating high school seniors, Class of 2014. Please be sure that the senior class college counselors from high schools in your area are aware of the availability of the HRYF scholarship grants for the 2014-2015 college years.

As in the past, application forms and allied information have been sent directly to all public and private high schools in the State of Hawaii. Additional copies are available on our website at www.hryf-d5000.org or www.rotaryd5000.org.

When a student calls you for sponsorship, they should be given the address where to mail their completed application. Remind them that a photograph must also be attached.

There is a requirement that the applicant submit the Student Aid Report (SAR). If the SAR is not available, a copy of all pages of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form which was sent to the mainland for processing will be acceptable. Financial need will be determined by the Final Selection Committee based on the SAR or FAFSA submitted by the applicant. Please write in the EFC (expected family contribution) located on the first page of the application from the SAR report.

The deadline for the scholarship application is January 31, 2014. You will have three (3) weekends to interview and submit one (1) candidate for scholarship by February 19, 2014 to the Area Selection Committee. A member of this committee will contact you before the deadline date.

CLUB SCHOLARSHIP INTERVIEW INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Scholarship applications should be delivered to you by January 31, 2014. Those mailing should be postmarked by January 31, 2014.
- 2. Check scholarship application for completeness and see that the following are included:
 - a. Photo Face only and no Xerox or computer copy.
 - b. Student Aid Report (SAR) or copy of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form.
 - c. Certified copy of the high school transcript.
 - d. Two (2) Recommendations for scholarship.
- 3. Every District 5000 Rotary club is entitled to <u>submit one (1) candidate</u> for consideration by the Area Selection Committee. This committee interviews and ranks applicants and HRYF then selects from all first place ranking, 2 students to receive the Maurice J. Sullivan (attending a mainland college) or Joanna L. Sullivan (attending a Hawaii college) awards of \$10,000 each instead of \$5,000. Every club will receive 1 scholarship award for a total of \$245,000.
- 4. Scholarship is for \$5,000 for graduating Hawaii high school students attending a 4-year university or college in Hawaii or the U.S. mainland. The student must be a U.S. citizen and a legal resident of Hawaii. Ineligible are Rotarians, their spouse, children, grandchildren, stepchildren, brothers or sisters. Also ineligible is anyone entering one of the U.S. Service Academies, receiving a "Full Scholarship" or attending a university outside the United States.
- 5. Use the suggested Evaluation Forms or formulate your own as a guide in the selection process.
- 6. Have at least three (3) Rotarians on the club selection committee. Your club interview deadline is February 15th.
- 7. Selection of scholars is to be based on scholastic and academic merit as well as community, extra curricular activities, and part-time employment, if any. Appropriate comments on the applicant's school, community, and job involvement should be indicated in the personal statement section of the application form.
- 8. Financial need will be determined by the final selection committee based on the Student Aid Report (SAR) or analysis of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form.
- 9. Applications must be signed and dated by the student and the three club selection committee members.
- 10. Inform the students and your club selection committee that judging will take place on a date of your choice no later than February 15, 2014. Select and announce interview location.
- 11. Set a deadline for delivery of applications and applied paperwork from the clubs to be in club committee possession. If possible, each committee member should have the opportunity to review applications prior to the interview.
- 12. Establish arrival time for judges and indicate interview time (slots) for students. If you decide on fifteen (15) minutes for each student and five (5) minutes for judge discussion between students, a time frame of twenty (20) minutes between students may be adequate. (Please note the time frame for interviews is left to your discretion since the number of applicants will be the determining factor).
- 13. Upon completion of the club selection process, <u>submit one (1) application</u> to the Area Selection Committee Chairman by <u>February 19th</u>. This committee chairman will contact each club prior to February 15th regarding how many sets are needed and where to mail them. <u>The Area Selection deadline is March 8th.</u>
- 14. Keep your second place applicant's application in case your first place applicant becomes ineligible.
- 14. The final selection will take place on March 17th. You will be contacted if your applicant is awarded the Maurice J. Sullivan or Joanna L. Sullivan awards of \$10,000 each. We will mail their award certificates to you for presentation at your Rotary club meeting.
- 15. The scholarship ad will be in the MidWeek Magazine around the week of May 28th.
- 16. Checks will be sent directly to the university or college on July 15th. HRYF will notify the university or college of the student who will receive a scholarship and the award amount on April 30th. This is necessary for the university or college to adjust their scholarship package.

Amount of Scholarship: Scholarship is for \$5,000 for graduating Hawaii high school students who will be attending a 4-year university or college in Hawaii or the U.S. Mainland. The student must be a U.S. citizen and a legal resident of Hawaii. Ineligible are Rotarians or their spouse, children, grandchildren, stepchildren, brothers or sisters. Also ineligible is any one entering the U.S. Service Academies, receiving a "Full Scholarship" or attending a university outside the United States. These scholarships are non-transferable and is a one-year grant sent to the university in two installments that need not be repaid. Enrollment must be in the Fall of the calandar year the scholarship is awarded. There are two \$10,000 special awards selected from all the applicants: 1) Maurice J. Sullivan Scholarship to attend a university on the mainland and 2) Joanna L. Sullivan Scholarship to attend a university in Hawaii.

Required: Attach a certified copy of your high school transcript with your application, Student Aid Report (SAR) or a photo copy of all pages of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form.

Letters of Recommendation: Submit two (2) Recommendations for Scholarship on form provided: One (1) from your present faculty member and one (1) from a member of your community (not another student).

Personal Statement: Please indicate the area of studies you expect to pursue and tell us what it would mean to you and to Hawaii, if you were to receive this scholarship.

Hawaii Rotary Youth Foundation Scholarship Program Application Deadline: January 31, 2014 – No exceptions

The Hawaii Rotary Youth Foundation (hereafter referred as HRYF) was chartered as a non-profit charitable Corporation in 1976 when Maurice J. Sullivan was the Rotary District Governor in Hawaii. One of its objectives is to provide scholarships for Hawaii's youth to further their education.

HRYF administers a scholarship aid program for Hawaii high school students who will be attending a 4-year university or college in Hawaii and on the U.S. mainland. Scholarship funds are derived from gifts and investment income from Hawaii Rotarians and The Harry & Jeanette Weinberg Foundation, Inc.

Eligibility Criteria:

- 1. Must be a graduating Hawaii high school senior who will be attending as a full-time student to an accredited 4-year college or university in Hawaii and on the U.S. mainland to earn a baccalaureate degree. A full-time student is defined as taking a minimum of twelve (12) credit hours per semester.
- 2. Must be a U.S. citizen and legal resident of Hawaii.
- 3. Ineligible are Rotarians or their spouse, children, grandchildren, stepchildren, brothers or sisters. Also ineligible is anyone entering one of the U.S. Military Academies, receiving a "Full Scholarship" or attending a university outside the United States.

Criteria for Selection:

- 1. Academic achievement, scholarship merit or financial need.
- 2. Personal involvement in campus, community activities and employment experience, if any.

Scholarships Available:

- 1. \$5,000 Scholarship to attend an accredited 4-year Hawaii or U.S. mainland university or college.
- 2. One (1) Maurice J. Sullivan Scholarship Award for \$10,000 to attend a university on the Mainland.
- 3. One (1) Joanna L. Sullivan Scholarship Award for \$10,000 to attend a university in Hawaii.

The scholarship is non-transferable and is a one-year grant sent to the universities in two installments. Enrollment must be in the Fall of the calendar year the scholarship is awarded.

The HRYF and Weinberg scholarship programs are administered without regard to race, creed, color, age, religion, sex, national origin or physical disability.

Scholarship Application Procedures:

- 1. Scholarship forms are available through your high school counselor, Rotary club in your area, our website at www.hryf-d5000.org or calling the HRYF office at 735-1073 on Monday or Thursday.
- 2. Submit the application to only one Rotary club where you live or where you attend high school. Refer to the listing of Rotary Clubs.
- 3. The application package should consist of:
 - a. Scholarship Application form with the applicant's picture attached.
 - b. Recommendation for Scholarship form from a present faculty member.
 - c. Recommendation for Scholarship form from a member of the community who has known the applicant for over 2 years (not another student).
 - d. Certified copy of applicant's high school transcript.
 - e. Student Aid Report (SAR) or a photo copy of all pages of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form that was sent to the mainland for processing.
 - f. Applicant's personal statement indicating area of study expected to be pursued and tell us what it would mean to them and to Hawaii if they were to receive this scholarship.
