### Participate in an International Service Project

- *Initiate* a Global Grant (GG) project (\$30,000+) or Vocational Training Team (VTT), enter but do not submit by 1 October.
- *Participate* in a GG project with a matching grant; check the D. 5000 website for a list of GGs sponsored by local Clubs.
- Sponsor or participate in a District Grant international project (for less than \$30,000), complete in one Rotary year, can partner with a non-Rotary organization, submit by 1 August.
- Participate in an International Literacy (educational) project
- Partner with a non-Rotary organization such as ShelterBox USA and Peace Corps.

### Participate in a Rotary International Exchange Program

- Intl Travel & Hosting Fellowship
- Group Cultural Exchanges
- Rotary Friendship Exchanges
- New Generations Exchanges
- Open World Program with Eastern European countries
- Youth Exchange Program

- Participate in NID--National Immunization Day (if still accepting volunteers)
