Serving ALL students statewide

295 PUBLIC SCHOOLS

- 258 HIDOE, 37 charter
- 173 elementary, 41 middle, 35 high, 46 mixed grades
- 34 schools offer Pre-K

169,000 STUDENTS

- 156,518 in HIDOE schools
 - 2,100 in HIDOE Kaiapuni immersion
- 12,116 in charter schools

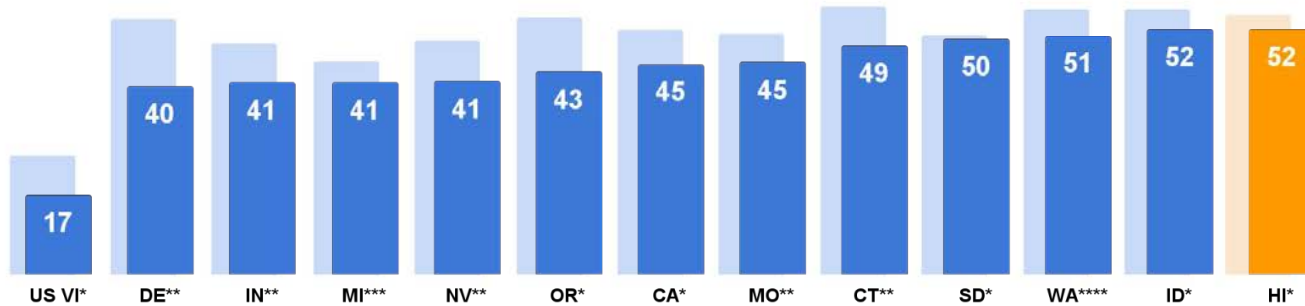

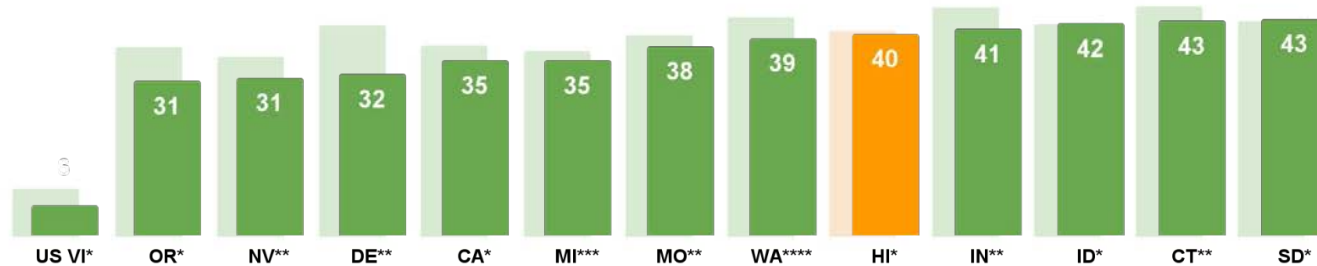
Hawai'i is a leading state

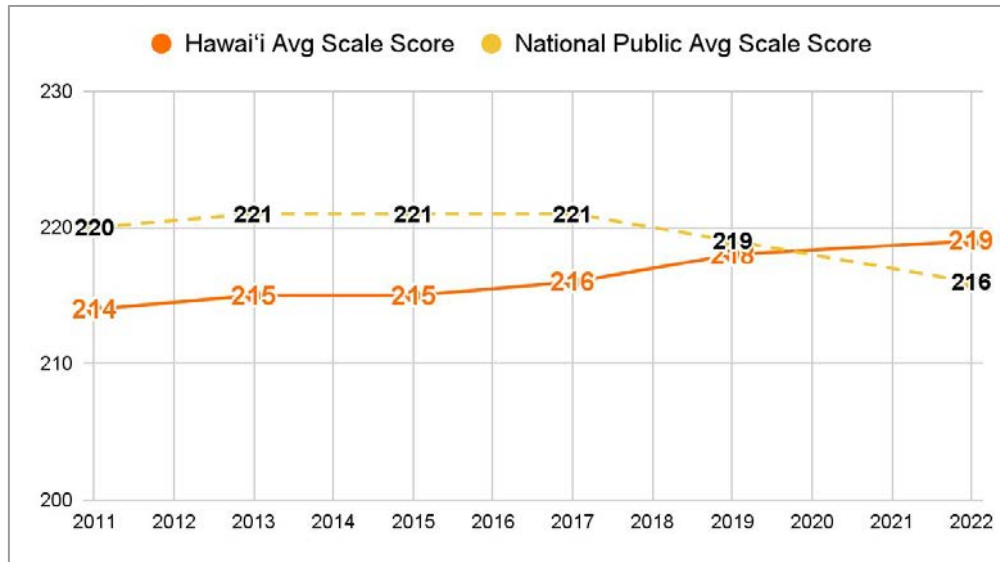
Pandemic impacts

Reading Grade 4



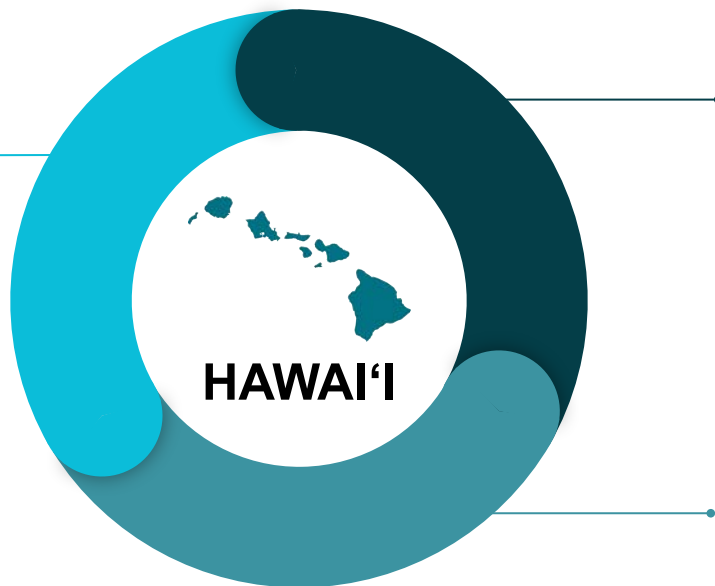

Together with continuing education, it fuels growth, ensuring employees have the competitive skills, knowledge and attitudes to support current, emerging and future businesses and industries.

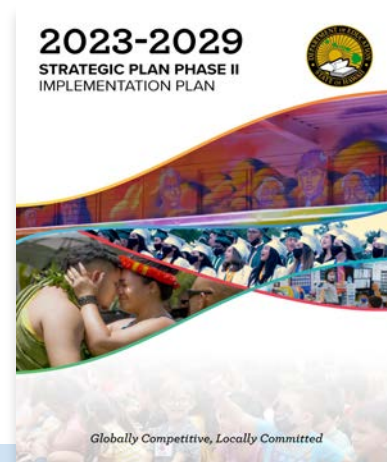

Conversation starters...

Host teacher “externships”

Collaborate with schools on **work-based learning opportunities** for students (e.g., internships, in-school experiences for students)

Participate in “sector partnerships” or **school-based advisory councils** to inform educators about industry’s current and future needs

Assist on campus (e.g., volunteer at school activities)

Support school’s **financial needs**:

Subsidize fees for economically disadvantaged students

Travel costs to events

Serve on **School Community Council** (monthly public meetings)

Ask about the school’s needs
